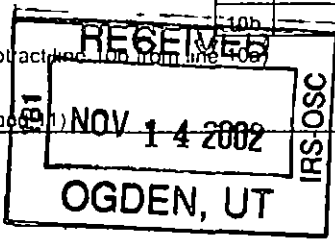

The Community Partnership for Arts and Culture (The Partnership)

FY 2001-2002 Accomplishments

Research

- The Partnership completed longitudinal market research titled, *"A Survey of Arts and Culture Consumers in Northeast Ohio Arts and Culture Participation – Benefits and Barriers "* This research is enhancing the information in Target Markets, our original market research project (available on our original website, www.cultureplan.org, under "research") Over 50 cultural workers participated in a workshop on how to use the research findings to improve their marketing efforts
- We provide research we conduct that includes economic impact studies, artist surveys, facilities research and arts and cultural organizational assessments All studies are available online at www.cultureplan.org
- We served as the liaison to the United States Urban Institute as they conducted research in Cleveland for their landmark study, *"Investing in Creativity A Study of the Support Structure of U S Artists "*
- We extract and analyze market data that specifically provides the distribution of cultural consumers by zip code To date a number of counties and municipalities have been served, including Geauga County, the City of Solon, Fairmount Fine Arts Center, Parma, Parma Heights and the Southwest Area Arts Partnership, a consortium of arts activities in seven communities (Berea, Brook Park, Columbia Station, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township and Strongsville) in southwest Cuyahoga County

Public Policy

- We organized a historic first Cleveland City Council Art and Culture Summit in May 2002, which drew over 600 people, including 30 key dignitaries



- The Partnership is consulting with Lake County Commissioners, who have formed a citizen task force to recommend how the county might generate stronger support for arts and culture. We designed the protocol for formation of the task force and assisted in the development of the economic survey instrument.
- We have identified potential public sector investment sources in Cuyahoga County to generate comprehensive support of local arts and cultural assets and have worked with elected and appointed officials to take action.
- We counseled the City of Solon on programming for the Old Courthouse Art Center and the selection criteria for its professional staff. The art center opens in October 2002.
- We provided testimony on relocation of the Fairmount Fine Arts Center to Bainbridge Township council.
- We provided data on public policy issues to
 - Geauga County cultural task force
 - Southwest Cuyahoga County Arts Partnership
 - Parma Fine Arts Council

Communication

- In May 2002 we published an online and print catalogue of arts and cultural education and outreach offerings. Over 80 organizations contributed information. The print catalogue was distributed to schools, nursing homes, community centers, churches, libraries and service organizations.
- The Partnership's newest website, www.culture4me.org, went live in May 2001. The site features a searchable calendar of cultural events around the region, with maps to venues and links to participating organizations. Last year, we added a new feature that allows organizations to list their education and outreach offerings.
- We joined with Ideastream WVIZ/WCPN 90.3 to co-produce *Applause!* a weekly arts and culture television program. In FY 2003 we will also work with Dee Perry to develop programs for her *Around Noon* series on WCPN.
- We continue providing story concepts on arts and culture to print and electronic media region-wide that include The Plain Dealer, The Akron Beacon Journal, News Herald, Sun Suburban News Papers, WVIZ, WKYC, WCPN, WCLV, and WKSU.



- We established the highly successful *Cuyahoga County Cultural Roundtable Series*, which generally draws together over 50 executive directors of arts and cultural organizations in their county to discuss common issues regarding collaboration, marketing and advocacy
- We joined with the Convention and Visitors Bureaus of Cleveland, Columbus and Cincinnati, and arts agencies in the latter communities, to create a website - ArtsinOhio.com - featuring arts and cultural offerings in Ohio's three largest cities. The effectiveness of this collaboration is being evaluated to determine its strategic effectiveness

Capacity Building

- Since May 2000 The Partnership has been engaged in providing technical assistance services in a variety of areas including financial management, fundraising, information technology, board development, survey development, research and advocacy
- Through a grant from the Wallace Readers Digest Fund, The Partnership is one of five regional partners with the Ohio Arts Council providing local arts and cultural organizations with databases, workshops and diagnostics leading to better business practices
- We worked with National Arts Stabilization (NAS) to develop CultureADD (Assess Diagnose Develop), an online diagnostic tool to assist small and medium-sized arts and cultural organizations build better business practices in the areas of financial management, strategic planning, human resources, communications, board operations and information technology
- We are providing market research distillation services for arts and cultural organizations, offering them the opportunity to apply our research, customizing it to help meet their specific marketing and communications objectives. Some of the organizations we have worked with include The Botanical Gardens, Young Audiences, Cleveland Public Theater, Akron Symphony Orchestra, Western Reserve Historical Society, University Circle, Inc., and Cleveland Center for Contemporary Art
- We have held working sessions with artists and academicians to establish an "Artist as Entrepreneur" program based on existing resources and artist's critical needs. We will work with COSE and various academic institutions to develop workshops in FY 2003
- The Partnership and Cuyahoga Community College co-sponsored "The Effects of September 11th" on October 4, 2001 and November 15, 2001



- The Partnership and The Greater Media Development Corporation co-sponsored a panel based on the movie based in North Hampton, MA titled "Downside Up" The purpose of the forum was to stimulate conversation on how arts and culture can stimulate economic growth in communities Panelists included AFL-CIO Executive Secretary John Ryan, Cleveland Tomorrow President Joe Roman, Cleveland Councilwoman Merle Gordon and Cleveland Councilman Joseph Cimperman
