Program service accomplishments	Form 990, Part III	<p>a - Animal Hospital and Mobile Veterinary Clinics (Program Service Expenses \$8,065,447) The ASPCA's full-service Bergh Memorial Animal Hospital, housed in our New York City headquarters, provided critical veterinary care to over 19,000 animals in need in 2005, including 4,438 emergency cases. A board certified Veterinary Pathologist was added to the hospital staff in 2005 to assist with the 228 injured animals rescued from abusive owners by our Humane Law Enforcement agents, a 56% increase over 2004. In 2005, we also added specialists in Cardiology and Dermatology. With the addition of digital radiology, we now have the capability of having our clients and referring specialists access patient radiographs via the internet. In 2005, the ASPCA Cares Mobile Clinic Program provided 11,232 free and low-cost spay and neuter surgeries to pets in underserved communities of New York City's five boroughs, a 23% increase over last year.</p> <p>b - ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center (Program Service Expenses \$4,683,640) The ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center ("APCC"), located in Urbana, Illinois, is the premier animal poison control center in North America, offering expert life saving advice to pet owners and veterinarians 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. APCC is staffed by 25 veterinarians including 10 board-certified toxicologists and 14 certified veterinary technicians, who handled over 106,500 individual cases in 2005, an 11.5% increase over 2004 and helped save more than 84,000 animals lives. These lifesaving efforts were aided by an expanded Veterinary Lifeline Partner Program, which enables more than 3,400 veterinary clinics across North America to gain rapid access to APCC experts in an emergency. This program allows veterinarians to establish an account with automated billing and provides a copy of the patient's record, including APCC recommendations, by email or fax. APCC also played a vital ongoing role in the Illinois Animal Terrorism Information Hotline, launched in 2003, to provide early identification of acts of terrorism involving animals so that government officials can respond rapidly to potential nuclear, biological or chemical threats.</p> <p>c - Humane Education and Shelter Outreach (Program Service Expenses \$17,453,493) The ASPCA continues to work with community shelters and animal rescue groups nationwide to find new, more effective ways to increase the number of successful pet adoptions. The ASPCA Outreach team awarded nearly \$600,000 in more than 600 non-hurricane-related grants to organizations from Alaska to Puerto Rico. Experts visited 242 shelters in 32 states and Canada, fielded over 15,000 requests for information and assistance, and presented 220 training sessions and workshops to more than 10,000 animal welfare professionals. The Meet Your Match Adoption Program was expanded to include both dogs and puppies. Over 300 organizations received training to implement the program. The ASPCA Veterinary Outreach program awarded over \$130,000 in grants to fund equine rescue efforts in 2005. ASPCA animal care experts authored and reviewed 65 veterinary articles or textbook chapters and gave presentations about animal cruelty and shelter medicine over the internet and at more than a dozen veterinary colleges and animal welfare conferences in 15 states. Humane Education partnered with nine shelters in Missouri, Tennessee, Michigan, Alaska and Illinois to distribute the ASPCA two-volume set of materials, I Love Animals (Yo Quiero a los Animales) and Sharing The World with Animals (Compartiendo El Mundo Con Los Animales) for students in kindergarten through fifth grade, in English and Spanish. Nearly 9,000 curriculums were distributed to 1,718 schools in these areas. In New York City, ASPCA staff presented over 100 student, parent and teacher programs and reached over 3,200 students and 100 adults. In an effort to promote April as ASPCA Prevention of Cruelty Month, the department distributed 20,000 pieces of free materials reaching 17,500 teachers and children across the country. Humane Education staff also exhibited, attended, and presented at 16 conferences nationwide.</p> <p>HURRICANE KATRINA Few events have challenged the animal welfare world like the Gulf Coast hurricanes of 2005. As Hurricane Katrina bore down on New Orleans in late August, millions of citizens along the Gulf Coast were forced to flee their homes, many without their beloved pets. By the time Hurricane Rita hit just a few weeks later, animal welfare groups had banded together to undertake the largest animal rescue mission in U.S. history. The ASPCA was among the first on the scene, aiding evacuation efforts even before Katrina hit and providing critical funding and expertise in the weeks and months that followed. ASPCA rescuers spent 20-hour days navigating 10-foot-deep floodwaters and mountains of debris to retrieve trapped, lost, and terrified pets and transport them to safety. Working hand-in-hand with thousands of animal welfare professionals and volunteers from across the country, the ASPCA helped rescue, reunite, and rehome more than 8,000 animals stranded by the devastation. In addition, we organized and dispatched volunteers, and coordinated purchase and shipment of emergency supplies. ASPCA supporters responded with an incredible outpouring of generosity, donating nearly \$16 million to the ASPCA Disaster Relief Fund in 2005 from which \$7.6 million was expended by year-end and most of the remainder committed. A \$2.5 million initial commitment was made to the Hurricane Reconstruction Fund, a multi-agency effort to rebuild shelters large and small and restore animal control programs throughout the region. More than \$10 million in aid was provided to hundreds of rescue and shelter operations across the country. Whether it was a few hundred dollars to transport a truckload of puppies to New England to free shelter space down south or reunite a lost pet with its parent, or millions of dollars to rebuild an entire shelter along the Gulf Coast, the ASPCA was there to help. National Outreach has extended that commitment for another two years to the Louisiana SPCA and Humane Society of Southern Mississippi, including capital rebuilding, staffing, and program development. National Outreach, through Imagine Humane, is coordinating a \$3 million Spay/Neuter Recovery Program, which will bring over 70,000 surgeries to the Gulf Coast region through collaboration with local organizations and veterinarians, Louisiana State University, and major national animal welfare groups. The 24/7 ASPCA Pet Loss Hotline assisted more than 500 grieving pet parents from across the country in 2005, a particularly vital service for victims of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. The ASPCA/Delta Society Animal-Assisted Therapy program provided visiting Pet Partner therapy dog teams to many of New York's major medical centers. Bugsey, a gentle Rottweiler who helps children learn to read in our Paws-n-Books program, was named "ASPCA Dog of the Year."</p> <p>d - Communications (Program Service Expenses \$6,345,185) The Media Relations and Advertising, Public Information and Communications departments give the ASPCA the vital exposure via television, radio, print media and the Internet, that it needs to provide valuable information to the public. In 2005, donated media resources were received for a nationwide television PSA valued at nearly \$2.4 million. In 2005, the ASPCA's Public Information Department responded to some 50,000 calls, e-mails, and letters from concerned citizens nationwide. Our professional customer service experts deal directly with inquiries on such topics as pet travel and insurance, breed rescue groups, cruelty issues, financial assistance, and referrals for animal sanctuaries and rescuers. We also reached the public at such flagship New York events as the Westminster Dog Show in February and Central Park's Canine Country Fair in October. ASPCA public relations, advertising, and media campaigns on radio, print, and TV, showcased such topics as Make Pet Adoption Your First Option, We Are Their Voice, and "The Top 5 Deadliest Plants to Pets." Animal Planet, available in 92 million households, prepared for a fifth season of the hit reality TV show Animal Precinct, featured a public service announcement with ASPCA Special Investigator Annemarie Lucas, and provided strong coverage of our Hurricane Katrina relief efforts. Satellite and radio media tours reached an additional 24 million viewers and listeners nationwide. The year 2005 saw the launch of a new member publication, ASPCA Action, which went out to many of our 750,000 active supporters, as well as a complete redesign of our Website, aspca.org, visited by millions for its vast storehouse of pet tips and information, legislative alerts, and daily updates following Hurricane Katrina. As recognition and support for the work of the ASPCA continues to grow, fewer animals will suffer and more will find loving homes in communities across America.</p> <p>e - Animal Placement and Behavior Training (Program Service Expenses \$5,441,545) The ASPCA Adoption Center in New York City, aided by our Mobile Adoption Program, placed 2,136 dogs and cats into loving new homes in 2005, a 9% increase over the previous year. The ASPCA also completed Phase 1 of its Manhattan shelter renovation. The new shelter virtually eliminates cage housing for dogs, providing glass condos complete with windows and cozy beds. Cats also get much more space, lots of light, and perching spots. Adoption efforts were aided greatly by the 30,316 hours of care provided by 689 animal-loving volunteers. The ASPCA is a founding member of the Mayor's Alliance for New York City's Animals, and is an active participant in the Maddie's Fund plan to help make New York City "No Kill" for all healthy and treatable cats and dogs. In awarding the Mayor's Alliance a start-up grant of \$5 million to be allocated over a five-year period starting in 2005, the ASPCA created the financial platform that was necessary to initiate the Maddie's Fund grant for the NYC "No Kill" effort. The ASPCA Animal Behavior Center, housed in our New York headquarters, continued to rehabilitate rescued and abandoned animals and offer effective training tools to community pet parents, assuring more animals remain in their adoptive homes. Our behavior program grew nationally in scope in 2005, as the first two graduates of the ASPCA Animal Behavior Fellowship program became certified, and planning got under way to launch a national Behavior Lifeline and a Master's-level graduate program in applied animal behavior through the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.</p> <p>f - Humane Law Enforcement (Program Service Expenses \$3,187,040) In 1866, the State of New York granted the ASPCA the legal authority to investigate and make arrests for crimes committed against animals. A hundred and forty years later, the ASPCA continues to advance the cause of animal protection by bringing new and expanded initiatives to fight cruelty to communities nationwide. Perhaps no group is more visible than the ASPCA Humane Law Enforcement team, featured weekly on the Animal Planet reality television series Animal Precinct. Every day, ASPCA agents are on the front lines of animal protection, rescuing abused and abandoned animals from life-threatening situations and bringing their abusers to justice. Millions of fans tuned in for a fourth successful season of the hugely popular show. In 2005, ASPCA Humane Law Enforcement agents initiated over 4,000 cruelty investigations, responded to over 50,000 inquires, and conducted training seminars throughout the United States which instructed Law Enforcement Officers in the investigation of animal cruelty. The ASPCA's fight to end cruelty extends far beyond the streets of New York City. In 2005, ASPCA agents and investigators teamed with experts in shelter outreach, legislation, humane education, and veterinary care to bring the fight to end cruelty to millions of Americans from coast to coast. ASPCA experts in animal law, shelter outreach, and humane care conducted 61 workshops to 1,170 police officers, judges, prosecutors, veterinarians, and others from Maine to California. Topics included officer safety, collecting evidence, documenting a crime scene, and the role of the veterinarian in fighting animal abuse. Our legislative efforts were greatly aided by the expanding, all-volunteer efforts of our ASPCA Advocacy Brigade, a national on-line community of animal lovers whose membership tripled in the past year to 496,000. ASPCA supporters wrote more than 190,000 letters to members of Congress in 2005, a two-fold increase over the previous year. 2005 highlights include Safer Air Travel for Pets - ASPCA spokespersons undertook a major media tour for the "Safe Air Transport for Animals Act," legislation the ASPCA spearheaded and which became effective June 1, 2005. The law requires U.S. airlines to report incidents of family pets injured, lost, or killed during transport, accountability that will lead to improved conditions for pets that must fly in cargo holds. Fingerprinting Abusers and Stemming Pet Overpopulation - Two new laws in New York State, spearheaded by the ASPCA, will help crack down on animal abuse and pet overpopulation, issues vital to the ASPCA. State law A 1011-A requires anyone arrested for misdemeanor animal cruelty to be fingerprinted and photographed, a measure that will help ensure that the criminal histories of these offenders are accurate and up-to-date. A 7644 expands coverage of New York's low-cost pay and neuter program to low-income residents, regardless of where they obtained their pets. Humane Education - A ban on the use of so-called "heart-stick euthanasia," or shots into the hearts of conscious animals, was signed into law by California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger. The ASPCA brought this issue to the attention of California law makers after receiving complaints that some shelters, and even some veterinarians, were using this cruel method to euthanize pets. Stray Dog and Feral Cat Control - "Anna's Bill," or the Illinois Public Health & Safety Animal Population Control Act (HB315), will generate \$2 million to fund low-cost spay and neuter programs in the state. Named after a jogger who was killed by vicious stray dogs in a woody Chicago park, the landmark bill was signed into law by Governor Blagojevich in August. The new law, one of dozens advanced by the ASPCA, makes Illinois the first state in the nation to provide funding for spaying and neutering feral cats. In addition to its lobbying activities, the Government Affairs/Public Policy staffs spend significant time and effort researching existing legislation, developing animal friendly public policy, and preparing related educational materials. In 2005, the ASPCA Legislative Services team updated its "Comprehensive Guide to State and Federal Animal Protection Laws," a database covering more than 30 animal protection issues and 550 animal cruelty laws - and their penalties - from all 50 states. Animal cruelty laws vary from state to state. Knowing your state's laws is crucial to help fight animal cruelty. In the area of Humane York City, the ASPCA drafted "Omnibus Animal Care and Control" and "Carriage Horse Regulations" for New York City, models that will serve as humane standards for communities across the United States. Other precedent-setting legislation included a "quality-assurance" standard for dogs based on the best practices of responsible breeders, a measure that will help stop puppy mills, and humane education laws consistent with the federal "No Child Left Behind" statute.</p>
