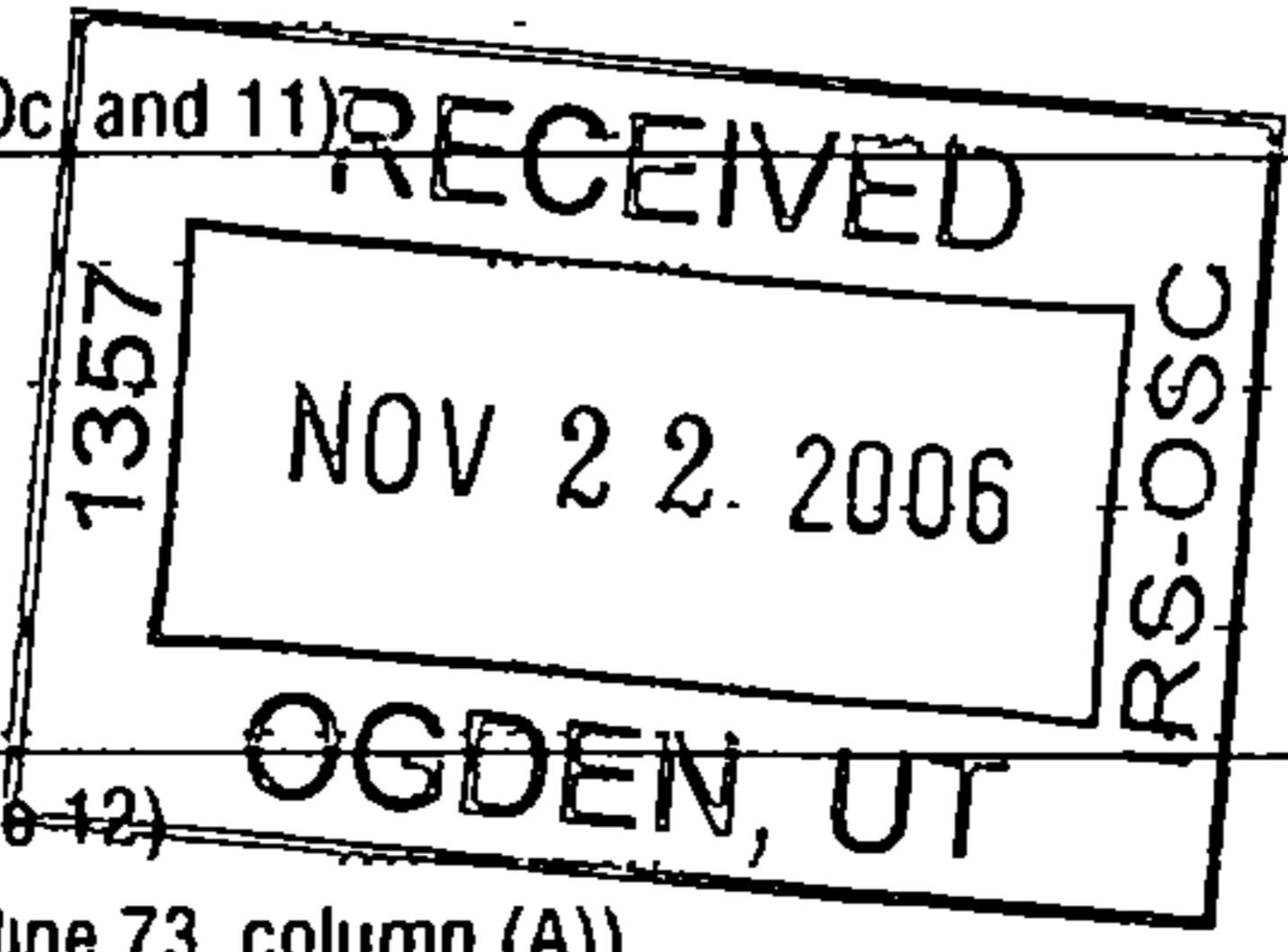

## **ECPAT-USA Program Service Accomplishments in 2005**

### **Sex Tourism**

In 2005 ECPAT-USA began major implementation of the Protect Children in Tourism (PCT) Project. Funded by the \_\_\_\_\_ the project has three components: awareness raising, training and resource provision. An important part of the Project is to encourage more companies to sign the Code of Conduct for the Protection of Children from Commercial Sexual Exploitation in Travel and Tourism. The first year of the two-year Project focused on securing partnerships in Mexico.

After a fact finding trip to Mexico, we decided to concentrate on Cancun, Mexico. We used criteria for selecting that city that included, number of Americans that travel there, existing partners who would be willing to cooperate with our project, extent of child sex tourism, etc. To carry out all the components of the project we held an awareness raising meeting, hosted by the Radisson Hotel in Cancun on May 19. The newly elected Mayor of Cancun spoke, as will the President of the Cancun hotel association. The Radisson Hotel will held a ceremonial signing of the Code of Conduct that day joined by a number of representative from the hotel industry.

Following up this big kick off event, ECPAT-USA staff and partners conducted trainings. We have subcontracted with a Mexican NGO to train students who are studying in the travel and tourism department at universities about sex tourism. These students will then be the ones who will train people who work in the travel and tourism industry in Cancun. This follows a model used by the International Labor Organization to train people in the travel industry in three other cities in Mexico. We will also train US consular and embassy personnel about what to do if they receive information about Americans who are sexually abusing children.

The third part of the project, resource provision, will involve providing information to NGOs and governments about the Code of Conduct, about services for sexually exploited children and developing relationships between Mexican law enforcement personnel and U.S. investigative authorities.

### **International Code of Conduct for the Protection of Children from Commercial Sexual Exploitation in Travel and Tourism.**

The Code of Conduct Secretariat now operates out of the ECPAT-USA office, funded by \_\_\_\_\_, the staff member, oversees the worldwide implementation of the Code of Conduct and serves as staff to the International Steering Committee. Recently, 60 Japanese companies signed the Code of Conduct. In the US, while one large company has signed, there has been no progress in getting other companies to sign the Code.

### **New York City Community Response to Trafficking Project**

ECPAT-USA is in the third year of this three year project funded by the \_\_\_\_\_. It has three components: training, outreach and convening of an NGO/law enforcement Working Group.

Trainings about human trafficking (about the TVPA, how to identify victims and where to refer victims when identified) continue to be conducted for many types of NGOs, including health clinics and domestic violence service providers. A training for Korean social service providers was held in Flushing. Additional trainings are scheduled in Chinatown in Manhattan and in Sunset Park, Brooklyn. Also, a training was held for 20 NYPD vice detectives and additional law enforcement trainings are planned, one with the Queens District Attorneys office and one with the Bronx District Attorneys office.

Outreach was conducted this year in conjunction with the International Rescue Committee's refugee resettlement office in Manhattan Chinatown, with the Lutheran Family Service Center and with the New York Asian Women's Center in Sunset Park, Brooklyn. Sunset Park is a neighborhood especially affected by human trafficking. It has both a large Mexican and a large Chinese population. Our outreach coordinator has helped establish a coalition of both Chinese and Mexican groups in Sunset Park. Together these groups held a street theater production at the end of June to educate people in the community about human trafficking and the protections available to victims.

The Working Group, consisting of local and federal law enforcement, community based organizations and service providers met every other month. It also completed a revised version of its "Guidelines for Responding to Trafficking in Persons in New York City." This is the first protocol in the country that establishes principles agreed on by both law enforcement and NGOs for what to do when a victim is identified. The Working Group is the model for the task forces recently funded by the Department of Justice in 22 jurisdictions around the country. The Working Group also established a legislative subcommittee to discuss New York State legislation against human trafficking that has been introduced.

#### **Sexual Exploitation of Children in the US**

ECPAT-USA published the original research report, "Who Is There to Help Us? How the System Fails Sexually Exploited Girls in the U.S." This report publication coincided with new federal legislation that was just introduced called the End Demand for Sex Trafficking Act of 2005 which follows some report recommendations. The bill authorizes funding for sexually exploited children and calls for training of law enforcement to understand that sexually exploited children are victims, not criminals.

#### **Public Awareness**

In addition to the awareness raising as part of projects on sex tourism and human trafficking, ECPAT-USA continues to speak at a number of venues including the UN, hotline worker training at the New York City Division for Youth and Community Development, panel during the Commission on the Status of Women meetings at the UN about human trafficking, sponsored by International Federation of Social Workers; a Sisters of Charity training in New Jersey; the US Catholic Conference of Bishops round table discussion about child trafficking; a child sex tourism training sponsored by the Bilateral Safety Coordinator Coalition in San Diego.
