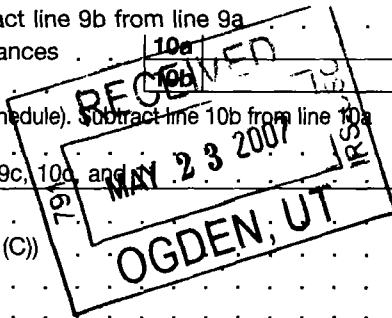

The *Achilles Track Club* is a worldwide organization that encourages people with disabilities to participate in running with the general public. Some who had difficulty negotiating the distance between light poles, often wind up competing in marathons. Achilles provides training, encouragement, and technical expertise to disabled athletes of all abilities. Runners participate with crutches, tethers for the blind, in wheelchairs, on artificial limbs and without aids.

Our signature event is the *Hope and Possibility 5 Mile Run/Walk*. It is a race in which able-bodied and disabled compete together. In 2006, it was held on Sunday, August 6, in Central Park. More than 2,700 participants registered, making it our most successful event to date.

Founded in 1983 in New York City, *Achilles* has expanded into several chapters in the United States and over one hundred locations in sixty-three countries – including Norway, Mongolia, Canada, Japan, Ecuador, New Zealand, Russia and South Africa.

Achilles has a youth program called *Achilles Kids*. In association with the office of Adaptive Physical Education of the NYC Board of Education, more than 3,000 children train at 142 public and private schools. The **ACHILLES FREEDOM TEAM of Wounded Veterans** is a program for disabled Iraqi war veterans that has over 260 members from Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Balboa Naval Hospital and Brooke Army Medical. They set goals and participate in running workouts; we anticipate 50 completing the 2007 NYC Marathon. Other programs in conjunction with different organizations provide eye surgery for blind runners, below-the-knee prostheses, and/or wheelchairs for Achilles members.

Membership to Achilles is free and includes races, coaching, workouts, team T-shirts, and our newsletter, THE ACHILLES HEEL. The Achilles Track Club is a nonprofit organization designated 501(c)(3).
