AKRON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I

General

Revised November 18, 2005

Section 1:     Name. The name of the Corporation is Akron Community Foundation (ACF).

Section 2:     Purpose. The purposes for which the Corporation is formed are as follows:

- a. To offer a means for public-spirited citizens to make charitable gifts with a flexibility in purpose and in application of income or principal, or both, to meet the changes in the community needs wrought by the passage of time and the variance in circumstances;
- b. To investigate, to engage in, to conduct, to support, to make grants to and promote charitable, benevolent, educational, health, aesthetic, cultural and public welfare activities, primarily but not exclusively in Summit County, Ohio, and for such purposes to accept, receive, take and hold absolutely or in trust gifts, legacies, bequests, devises, remainders, funds and property of any kind, nature or description without limitation as to amount of value; to sell, convey and dispose of any of such funds and property and to invest and reinvest the principal thereof without being limited to statutory or legal investments for fiduciaries, and to use, apply, employ, deal with, expend, contribute and donate the principal or income, or both the principal and the income, for any of the aforementioned objects and purposes, either directly or jointly with others or through any charitable, benevolent, education, aesthetic, cultural, health or public welfare corporation, association, agency or institution, or through the providing of scholarships. All of the foregoing provisions in this Paragraph (b) are subject always to the provisions and limitations hereinafter contained relating to the distribution of assets from any particular trust fund in accordance with the directions of the donor of such particular fund for specific purposes included within the general purposes set forth in this Paragraph (b);
- c. To accept any grant from any donor upon the terms, trusts and conditions set forth in the instrument making the grant and to comply with the terms of said grant to the end that any property so accepted by the corporation shall be forever held, used and distributed for such of the purposes set out in Paragraph (b) above as may have been specified or preferred by the donor and no deviation therefrom shall be permitted unless and until it is affirmatively determined that literal



compliance with the purposes or wishes expressed in the granting instrument has become by reason of change of circumstances, unnecessary, undesirable, impracticable or illegal. Upon such determination the corpus or income or both may be applied for any purpose of this Corporation. The making of a gift, grant, devise or bequest by any donor to ACF shall be deemed to include the express assent and direction that the donor's expressed desire as to the use and disposition of income or principal shall be respected, and observed, subject, however to the condition that the provisions herein contained relating to the application of such trust funds to other purposes shall govern. A transfer to ACF by trustees of a trust shall not constitute such an assent by the donor of such trust unless so expressed in the instrument creating the trust, it being the intent that ACF may accept appointment as substitute or alternate trustee by designation of the prior trustee or by court appointment and as to such a trust will be controlled by the instrument creating it; and

- d. No part of the activities of this Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any Member and no part of the activities of this Corporation shall consist in the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and this Corporation shall not directly or indirectly participate in any, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office, including the publishing or distributing of statements with respect thereto.

Section 3: Powers. ACF shall have such powers as are now, or may hereafter be granted by the Non-Profit Corporation Law of Ohio as found in Chapter 1702 of the Ohio Revised Code, by its Articles of Incorporation and by this Code of Regulations.

## ARTICLE II

### Office

The principal office of ACF shall be in the City of Akron, County of Summit, State of Ohio.

## ARTICLE III

### Membership

The Members of ACF are its current Trustees. Election of a Trustee as provided in this Code of Regulations shall likewise operate to elect such Trustee as a Member of ACF. A Trustee, for the purpose of any statutory provision or rule of law relating to Ohio Non-Profit Corporations, shall be taken to be a Member of ACF and shall have and exercise all of the rights, privileges, powers and immunities of Members thereof.

## ARTICLE IV

### Membership Meetings

- Section 1: Annual Meeting - Time, Place and Purpose. The Annual Meeting of the Members of ACF shall be held in May at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees, and stated in the Notice of Meeting, or at such other place and time as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees and stated in the Notice of Meeting. At the Annual Meeting, the duly elected Trustees, as provided for in Article V, shall take office and transact such other business as may be properly brought before the Annual Meeting.
- Section 2: Notice for Annual Meeting. Notice of the Annual Meeting of the Members of ACF, stating the time and place of the Annual Meeting, shall be delivered by mail not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of the Annual Meeting to the Members, by or at the direction of the Chair, the Secretary or the Officer calling the Annual Meeting. Notice of the adjournment of the Annual Meeting need not be given if a time and place to which it has been adjourned are fixed and announced at such Annual Meeting.
- Section 3: Special Meetings. A Special Meeting of the Members of ACF may be called by the Chair; and in the case of the Chair's absence, disability or death, the Vice Chair, or six (6) Members.
- Section 4: Notice of Special Meeting. Written notice of a Special Meeting of the Members of ACF stating the time, place and purpose of the Special Meeting shall be delivered by mail not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of the Special Meeting to the Members by or at the direction of the person or persons calling the Special Meeting. Notice of Adjournment of a Special Meeting need not be given if the time and place to which it is adjourned are fixed and announced at such Special Meeting.

## ARTICLE V

### Trustees

- Section 1: General Powers. Except as stated in the Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of Ohio, the Articles of Incorporation or the Code of Regulations of ACF require that action shall be otherwise authorized or taken, all authority of ACF shall be exercised by its Board of Trustees.
- Section 2: Number of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall consist of no less than twenty (20) nor more than twenty-four (24) Trustees. In the instance described in Section 4 of this Article V, the maximum number of Trustees shall be twenty-five (25). At least five (5) Trustees shall be elected at each Annual Meeting of the



Members. The number of Trustees may be increased or decreased by the Members at the Annual Meeting of the Members.

Section 3:     Election of Trustees. Election of the Trustees of ACF shall be held at the Annual Meeting of the Members or at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees, and stated in the Notice of Meeting. Notice of this Meeting, stating the time and place of the Meeting, shall be delivered by mail not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of the Meeting to the Members, by or at the direction of the person or person calling the Meeting.

Section 4:     Tenure. The term of office of Trustees shall be three (3) years. Their terms shall be staggered so that no less than five (5) Trustees shall be elected each year. Trustees shall serve until their successors take office. No Trustee shall serve for more than nine (9) consecutive years, except a retiring Chair who has served for nine (9) consecutive years shall remain a Trustee for an additional one (1) year term. After completion of maximum consecutive service, a Trustee is not eligible for re-election until one (1) year has elapsed.

Section 5:     Resignation. A Trustee may resign at any time, either by oral tender of resignation at any Meeting of the Board of Trustees or by giving written notice thereof to the Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified and acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. On resignation, the resigning Trustee shall no longer be a Member of ACF.

Section 6:     Removal. A Trustee may be removed, with or without cause, at a Meeting called expressly for that purpose, by a vote of the majority of the Trustees in office. On removal, the removed Trustee shall no longer be a Member of ACF.

Section 7:     Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring or existing in the Board of Trustees may be filled by vote of the remaining Trustees upon recommendation of the Nominating/Board Development Committee. A Trustee elected to fill a vacancy in the Board of Trustees shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

Section 8:     Compensation. Trustees shall serve without compensation; provided, however, that nothing herein shall preclude a Trustee from receiving compensation for goods or services provided to ACF in any capacity other than as its Trustee.

Section 9:     Organizational Meeting of Trustees. The Organizational Meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held following the Annual Meeting of the Members of ACF and before the fourth Wednesday of June, or on a date and at such time and place as may be selected by the Chair, for the election of Officers and for the transaction of such business as may come before the Meeting. Newly elected Officers shall take office at the Organizational Meeting of Trustees. The Organizational



Meeting of Trustees shall be at the place, date and time specified on the Notice of Meeting.

Section 10: Regular Meetings. Unless otherwise provided by resolution of the Board of Trustees, regular Meetings of the Board of Trustees other than the Organizational Meeting shall occur in the months of February, May, August and December.

Section 11: Special Meetings. Special Meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called by the Chair or any six (6) Trustees at such place and time as the person or persons calling the Meeting shall specify.

Section 12: Location of Meetings. Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held in Akron, Ohio or at any other place within the State of Ohio as specified in the Notice of Meeting.

Section 13: Notice. Notice of the time and place of each Meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be given to each Trustee by mail no less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of the Meeting, which Notice need not specify the purpose of the Meeting. Notice of the adjournment of a Meeting need not be given if the time and place to which it is adjourned are fixed and announced at such Meeting. The attendance of a Trustee at a Meeting shall constitute Waiver of Notice of such Meeting except where a Trustee attends a Meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the Meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

Section 14: Quorum and Voting. The physical presence of twelve (12) Trustees is necessary to constitute a quorum for a Meeting of the Board of Trustees. The act of a majority of the Trustees present at a Meeting at which a quorum is present is the act of the Board of Trustees. Each Trustee shall be entitled to one (1) vote. Proxy voting shall not be permitted for any purpose.

Section 15: Procedure. The Chair of ACF shall preside at the Meetings of the Board of Trustees and shall consult Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, on matters of procedure not specifically covered by this Code of Regulations.

Section 16: Performance Requirements of Trustees. A Trustee shall be expected to:

- a. Attend with regularity the Meetings and functions of the Board of Trustees;
- b. Serve on Committees of ACF and attend those Meetings with regularity;
- c. Provide ACF with the benefit of the Trustee's experience, knowledge, judgment and influence; and

- d. Provide asset development assistance and personal financial support within the means of the Trustee.

Section 17: Powers of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall have the power to establish policies, conduct the affairs of ACF and to exercise all powers granted by the laws of the State of Ohio to nonprofit corporations, by the Articles of Incorporation and by this Code of Regulations. The Board of Trustees shall have the power to modify any restriction or condition on the distribution of funds for any specified charitable purposes or to specified organizations if, in the sole judgment of the Board of Trustees (without the approval of any trustee, custodian or agent), such restriction or condition becomes, in effect, unnecessary, incapable of fulfillment, or inconsistent with the charitable needs of the community or the area served by ACF.

Section 18: Attendance at Meetings by Communications Equipment. Trustees who are not physically present at meetings of the Board may attend such meetings by the use of teleconference or other electronic communications equipment that enables the Trustee an opportunity to participate in the meeting and to vote on matters submitted to the Board of Trustees, including the opportunity to read or hear the proceedings of the meeting, participate in the proceedings, and contemporaneously communicate with the Trustees who are physically present at the meeting. Any Trustee who uses such teleconference or other electronic communications equipment shall be deemed to be present in person at the meeting, whether the meeting is held at a designated place or solely by means of teleconference or other electronic communications equipment.

## ARTICLE VI

### Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees

Section 1: Composition. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Secretary, Chair of the Distribution Committee and up to two (2) additional Trustees as may be appointed annually by the Chair to serve as Members-at-Large.

Section 2: Duties. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the management of the Corporation between Meetings of the Board of Trustees. The Executive Committee shall have all the powers of the Board of Trustees in the management of the affairs of the Corporation between Meetings of the Board of Trustees and shall report its actions at the next Board of Trustees Meeting. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for evaluation of the performance of the President, and the Secretary shall maintain appropriate minutes and records of such evaluations.

## ARTICLE VII



### Distribution Committee

Section 1: Composition. The Distribution Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) Members.

Section 2: Duties. The Distribution Committee shall be responsible for the thorough investigation and review of all qualifying grant applications and shall develop recommendations for the funding of such grant applications to be presented to the Board of Trustees for action. The Distribution Committee will determine if its recommendations for funding are in accordance with grant guidelines of ACF as the same may, from time to time, be developed by the ACF staff and approved by the Board of Trustees.

### ARTICLE VIII

#### Finance and Investment Committee

Section 1: Composition. The Finance and Investment Committee shall consist of at least five (5) Members, including the Treasurer who shall serve as its Chair. Its Membership shall include at least one Member of the Community Relations Committee and the Distribution Committees.

Section 2. Duties. The Finance and Investment Committee shall have responsibility for the fiduciary oversight and monitoring of the investment of ACF assets, the ACF investment managers and, ACF's expenditures for administration and grant making. The Finance and Investment Committee shall assist the President in developing an annual budget and in ensuring that the operations of ACF are conducted in accordance with is budget. Its Membership shall include Members with experience in finance, management of investments and management of costs.

### ARTICLE IX

#### Community Relations Committee



Section 1:     Composition. The Community Relations Committee shall consist of at least five (5) Members, one of whom shall be a Member of the Finance and Investment Committee.

Section 2:     Duties. The Community Relations Committee shall be responsible for providing a public information program for the benefit of ACF, to gain public attention and understanding of its work. The Community Relations Committee shall work with the staff of ACF in the publication of promotional materials, news releases and advertisements and in meetings, seminars and activities to support the efforts of the ACF and special events of ACF. The Community Relations Committee shall also be responsible for the growth and development of the permanent endowment of ACF from private and public sources. It shall carry out a plan for raising the maximum amount of permanent endowment funds and shall be ever vigilant to ACF efforts to meet its public support requirement.

## ARTICLE X

### Nominating/Board Development Committee

Section 1:     Composition. The Nominating/Board Development Committee shall consist of three (3) Members, each of whom shall have served at least three (3) years as a Trustee.

Section 2:     Duties. The Nominating/Board Development Committee shall be responsible for the nomination of a slate of Trustees and Officers for presentation to the Members at the Annual Meeting and the Trustees at their May Meetings. It shall seek the input of the Chair, Vice Chair and President in the process of selecting prospective nominees for Trustees and Officers. It shall circulate to the Trustees the names of proposed nominees for Trustees and Officers at least thirty (30) days prior to their election. It shall be responsible for determining the needs of the Board of Trustees, evaluating the performance of Trustees and maintaining and developing a list of potential Trustees. In addition, the Nominating/Board Development Committee shall be responsible for communicating the performance requirements of Trustees to prospective Trustees, orientation and training of newly elected Trustees.

## ARTICLE XI

### Committees

Section 1:     Committees. Committees may be created and abolished by the Board of Trustees. Such Committees shall be appointed by the Chair from among the Trustees and shall discharge such responsibilities as may be assigned to them.

- Section 2:     Committee Chairs. Committee Chairs shall be appointed by the Chair from among the Trustees following the Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees.
- Section 3:     Committee Advisors. Committee Advisors may be appointed by the Chair from among the friends and staff of ACF.
- Section 4:     Committee Structure. The Committees shall be structured to provide flow of communication between Committees.
- Section 5:     Ex-Officio Members. The Chair, Vice Chair and the President shall be Ex-officio members of the Distribution, Finance and Investment and Community Relations Nominating Board and Development Committees. Ex-officio members of Committees shall be entitled to all of the rights and privileges of regular Committee members but shall not vote or be counted in determining the existence of a quorum.
- Section 6:     Tenure. Each member of a Committee shall serve until the next Organizational Meeting of the Board of Trustees, a successor is appointed or the member is removed by the Executive Committee, whichever occurs first.
- Section 7:     Quorum. A majority of the whole Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- Section 8:     Manner of Acting.
- a.     Formal Action by Committee. The act of a majority of a Committee present at a Meeting at which quorum is present shall be the act of the Committee; and
  - b.     Action of the Committee by Consent. No action of a Committee shall be valid unless taken at a Meeting at which a quorum is present, except that any such action which may be taken at a Meeting of a Committee may be taken without a Meeting if a consent in writing setting forth the action so taken shall be signed by each Committee member.
- Section 9:     Removal. Any member of a Committee may be removed by the Executive Committee whenever, in its judgment, the best interests of ACF shall be served by such removal.
- Section 10:    Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of any Committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointment.
- Section 11:    Expenditures. Any expenditure of ACF funds by a Committee shall require prior approval of the Board of Trustees or the Executive Committee.

## ARTICLE XII

## Officers

- Section 1:     Officers. The Officers of ACF shall consist of a Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and such other Officers as the Board of Trustees may from time to time elect.
- Section 2:     Election and Term of Office. The Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Secretary, and other Officers of ACF shall be elected annually from the Board of Trustees by plurality vote of the Trustees at the Organizational Meeting of the Trustees or at a Special Meeting held for that purpose. Officers shall hold office until their successors shall have been duly elected, accepted office, and assumed their duties. The Officers of ACF shall be nominated by the Nominating/Board Development Committee and shall be elected at the Organizational Meeting of the Board of Trustees and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees. No Officer shall serve in that office for more than two (2) consecutive years. Any Officer elected to fill a vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of his or her predecessor and may thereafter be elected for up to two (2) consecutive years.
- Section 3:     Removal. Any Officer elected by the Board of Trustees may be removed by the Board of Trustees whenever in its judgment the best interests of ACF would be served thereby.
- Section 4:     Vacancies. A vacancy in office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise may be filled by the Board of Trustees for the unexpired portion of the term.
- Section 5:     Chair. The Chair shall be the Chief Volunteer Officer and have general overall supervision of all of the business and affairs of ACF. Responsibilities shall include, without limitation, the following:
- a.     Acting as the representative of ACF to the public as well as to governmental organizations;
  - b.     Making policy proposals to the Board of Trustees;
  - c.     Assigning overall responsibility for corporate management
  - d.     Reporting to the Board of Trustees on the performance of corporate functions; and
  - e.     Serving as an Ex-officio member of the Distribution, Finance and Investment and Community Relations.

The Chair may sign, with the Secretary or any other Officer of ACF authorized by the Board of Trustees, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which have been



authorized to be executed. In general, the Chair shall perform all duties incident to the function of Chief Volunteer Officer and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Trustees from time to time. The Chair shall preside at all Meetings of the Board of Trustees. All Officers shall report to the Chair.

Section 6:     Vice Chair. The Vice Chair shall serve as Chief Executive Officer in the absence of the Chair.

Section 7:     Secretary. The Secretary shall ensure that Notices of Meetings of Members and Board of Trustees are given in accordance with this Code of Regulations and that Minutes are recorded at such Meetings. The Secretary also shall be responsible for maintaining appropriate minutes and records of evaluations of the President. The Board of Trustees may designate the President or another Member of the ACF staff to serve as Assistant Secretary for purposes of taking minutes at Meetings of the Members, Board of Trustees and Executive Committee.

Section 8:     Treasurer. The Treasurer shall direct and monitor the President and the staff in the control and handling of funds of ACF. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the design of systems for recording receipts and disbursements and for supervision of the preparation of financial reports to the Executive Committee and Board of Trustees.

### ARTICLE XIII

#### President of ACF

Section 1:     Duties. The President of ACF shall be employed by the Board of Trustees as the chief professional officer of the Corporation. The President shall be the Chief Operating Officer for the business affairs of ACF, reporting to its Chair. Responsibilities shall include, without limitation, the following:

- a.     Acting as a representative of ACF to the public as well as to governmental organizations;
- b.     Making administrative and operational policy proposals to the Board of Trustees;
- c.     Directing the day-to-day activities of the office;
- d.     Employing, supervising and evaluating the administrative staff;
- e.     Providing appropriate administrative support for ACF Committees and activities;

- f. Serving as an Ex-Officio Member of the Executive, Distribution, Finance and Investment, Community Relations, and Nominating/Board and Development Committees; and
- g. Serving as Assistant Secretary, when so designated by the Board of Trustees.

#### ARTICLE XIV

##### ACF Colleagues

Section 1: Purpose. The Colleagues shall be a group of persons, committed to volunteerism and philanthropy, who seek to serve ACF in the achievement of its objectives. They shall provide development and financial support to ACF and seek to assume the mantle of its leadership by providing a training ground for candidates as potential Trustees. The President shall designate a member of the staff of ACF to serve as an Ex-officio Member of the Colleagues.

#### ARTICLE XV

##### Indemnification

Section 1: General.

- a. Subject to the provisions of Paragraph (b) hereinafter set forth, ACF shall defend, indemnify and save harmless each person, and the heirs, legal representatives, executors and administrators of such person, who is, or was, a Trustee, Officer, Employee or Agent of ACF or who is, or was , serving as a fiduciary of a retirement or welfare plan maintained by ACF or who is, or was, serving at the request of ACF and for the benefit of ACF in any of the foregoing capacities for another corporation, domestic or foreign, nonprofit or for profit, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise (all of the previously enumerated positions shall hereinafter be referred to as "Covered Position"), against all costs and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and disbursements, judgments, funds penalties and amounts paid in settlement) actually and reasonably incurred by him or her or imposed upon him or her;
  - 1. In connection with or arising out of any claim, action, suit, proceeding or investigation (or any issue or matter therein), whether civil, criminal, administrative, or whatever nature, to which he or she is made or threatened to be made a party or in which he or she is necessarily involved by reason of the fact that he or she is, or was, serving in any one or more of the Covered Positions; and
  - 2. In connection with any negotiations or settlement thereof, or appeal therein.



b. The provisions of Section 1(a) herein shall not be effective unless the person who is, or was, serving in a Covered Position:

1. Is determined to have acted in good faith;
2. Is determined to have acted in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of any such corporation or enterprise; and
3. Is determined in any matter the subject of a criminal action, suit or proceeding, to have had no reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful;

The termination of any action, suit or proceeding, or any issue or matter therein, by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of *nolo contendere*, or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the interests of any such corporation or enterprise, and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that he or she had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

c. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section 1, no indemnification shall be made by ACF with respect to any claim, suit, issue, or matter, by or in the right of ACF, as to which a person who is, or was, serving in a Covered Position, shall have been adjudicated to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to a corporation or enterprise unless, and only to the extent that the Court of Common Pleas, or the court in which such action or suit was brought, shall determine, upon application by ACF, and in view of all the circumstances of the case, that such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses as the Court of Common Pleas or such other court shall deem proper.

d. Any indemnification provided for under this Section 1, unless ordered by a court as provided in Paragraph (c) hereinabove, shall be made by ACF only after a determination that such indemnification of a person who is, or was, serving in a Covered Position is proper because he or she has met the standards of conduct stated in Paragraph (b) hereinabove as follows:

1. By a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Trustees of ACF who were not and are not parties to or threatened with any such action, suit or proceeding; or
2. If such a quorum of Trustees is not obtainable or if a majority vote of a quorum of disinterested Trustees so directs, then in a written opinion by



independent legal counsel other than an attorney, or a firm having associated with it an attorney, who has been retained by or who has performed services for ACF, or who has been indemnified by ACF within the past five years; or

3. By the affirmative vote of the Members of ACF; or
4. By the Court of Common Pleas or the court in which such action, suit or proceeding was brought.

Any determination made according to methods (1) and (2) above shall be promptly made accordingly and (2) above shall be promptly communicated to any person who threatened or brought an action or suit by or in the right of ACF;

- e. Expenses, including attorneys fees, incurred with respect to any claim, action, suit, proceeding or investigation (or any issue or matter therein) of the character described in this Section 1 may be advanced by this Corporation prior to the final disposition thereof as authorized by the Trustees in a specific case upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of a person serving in a Covered Position, to repay such amount if it is ultimately determined that he or she is not entitled to indemnification or, where indemnification is granted, to the extent the expenses so advanced exceed the indemnification to which he or she is entitled; and
- f. Such indemnification as provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which a person who is, or was, serving in a Covered Position may be entitled under ACF's Articles of Incorporation, Code of Regulations, or any agreement, vote of Shareholders of disinterested Directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased serving in a Covered Position and shall inure to the benefits of the heirs, legal representatives, executors and administrators of such person.

Section 2: Insurance. ACF may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is, or was, serving in a Covered Position against any liability asserted against him or her or incurred by him or her in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not ACF would have the power to indemnify him or her against such liability under Section 1 above.

## ARTICLE XVI

### Contracts and Banking

Section 1:     Contracts. The Board of Trustees may authorize any Officer or Officers, Agent or Agents, to enter into any contract or execute or deliver any instrument in the name of or on behalf of ACF, and such authority may be general or confined to special instances.

Section 2:     Deposits. All funds of ACF not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of ACF in such banks, trust companies or other depositaries as the Board of Trustees or the Executive Committee may select.

Section 3:     Checks. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of ACF shall be signed by such Officer or Officers, Agent or Agents of ACF and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

Section 4:     Loans. No loan shall be made to ACF and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Trustees.

## ARTICLE XVII

### Accounting Year and Audit

Section 1:     Accounting Year. The fiscal year of ACF shall begin on the first day of April and end on the last day of March.

Section 2:     Audit. At the end of the accounting year, the books of ACF shall be closed and a financial statement prepared for such year. The financial statement shall be certified by an independent firm of certified public accountants. Such financial statements shall be promptly mailed to each Trustee and shall be submitted at the Annual Meeting.

## ARTICLE XVIII

### Amendments

Section 1:     Procedure. The Code of Regulations may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Trustees present and voting at any regular or specially called Meeting of the Board of Trustees at which a quorum is present, provided that the text of the proposed amendment has been set forth in the Notice of Meeting.
