Most of the organizations support in the past has come about from a combination of grant applications and personal solicitations by the organizations officers and directors, resulting in contributions from foundations, individuals, and corporations who know and are familiar with the work of the organizations directors and officers. Thus, the organizations public support has come about by virtue of the outstanding reputation of the organization and its Board of Directors. In addition to meeting the two requirements discussed above, public support of the organization is evidenced by a discussion of the other relevant public support factors described in Section 1.170A-9(e)(3) of the Income Tax Regulations, as follows:</p> <p>(1) Percentage of financial support factor. As indicated above, the organization received 17.49 percent of its support from contributions made directly by the general public. This is reasonably close to the one-third support standard, and significantly above the 10 percent standard required to meet the facts and circumstances test.</p> <p>(2) Sources of support factor. As indicated above in paragraph (1), the organization did not conduct formal solicitation programs, but relied primarily on personal contacts and its established reputation to solicit funds.
