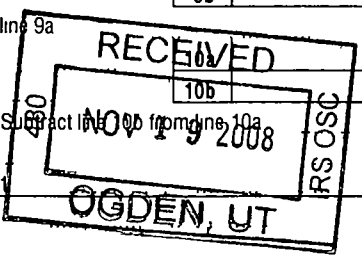

**BYLAWS
OF
CASA OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, Inc.**

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization is CASA of Douglas County, Inc.

**ARTICLE II
OBJECT**

The object of this organization is to operate a Court Appointed Special Advocate program for abused and neglected children, who are under the legal jurisdiction of the Department of Human Services, Child Welfare Program, and, as determined by the Board of Directors, to otherwise act and advocate for the interests of the children.

**ARTICLE III
POLICY**

The organization shall, at least bi-annually, review the standards set out by the National CASA Association. This program shall comply with all mandatory standards of the National CASA Association and shall endeavor to comply with all other National CASA Association standards.

**ARTICLE IV
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

Section 1.

The business and affairs of the organization shall be managed by a Board of Directors. There shall be no less than five and no more than fifteen directors. The Board shall have the power and authority to make rules and manage the organization in all respects, consistent with the laws of the State of Oregon. The Board shall be composed of individuals from a cross-section of the community.

Section 2.

New director terms shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum of the board members.

Section 3.

Director's terms shall be staggered so that approximately one-third of the Board is elected each year after the original rotation is in place. Directors shall be appointed at the organization's June meeting, except that in the case of a director vacating the board before the end of a term, the director's position shall be filled within a reasonable time after the position becomes vacant.

If necessary to achieve evenly staggered terms, Directors shall be appointed to serve on the Board for a one-, two- or three-year term. Otherwise, directors shall be appointed for a 3 year term. However, if a director is appointed to complete the term of another director who is unable to finish his or her term, the newly appointed director's term shall expire at the end of the term of the director who is replaced.

At the end of a director's first appointed term, he or she may be appointed, without interruption, to a second term of three years duration. After two terms, a director may be appointed to subsequent term(s), but only after a hiatus of at least one year between terms.

Section 4.

The Board of Directors shall elect the Chairperson of the Board of the corporation at the Annual Meeting, following the close of the fiscal year. A vacancy will be filled as soon as possible.

Section 5.

The Board of Directors shall have the responsibility of hiring, supervising, evaluating, retaining and/or terminating the Executive Director.

Section 6.

No person may simultaneously be a voting member of the Board of Directors and serve as a paid employee of the Corporation.

ARTICLE V
QUORUM

A majority of the Board of Directors constitutes a quorum necessary for the transaction of business.

If a quorum cannot be present for voting, a telephone poll of absent members can be done and the results so noted in the minutes of the meeting. This excludes action on Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI
MEETINGS

Section 1.

The regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held monthly, insofar as is possible, on a day and time selected by the directors.

Section 2.

An annual meeting shall be held at a time and place designated by a majority of the Board of Directors.

Section 3.

Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called by the Chairperson of the Board or any two Directors, to be held at a reasonable time and date. Notification of special meetings may be done by telephone, except in the matter of Bylaws.

Section 4.

A regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors, which includes the amending of the Bylaws, requires a written notice of the meeting be sent to all Board members prior to the meeting. A two-thirds affirmative vote of the quorum is required to amend the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII
OFFICERS

Section 1.

The officers of the organization shall consist of a Chairperson of the Board, a Vice-Chairperson, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The Board of Directors will elect the officers at the beginning of the fiscal year, to serve one year. They may be re-elected. Vacancies will be filled as needed.

Section 2.

Chairperson: Shall preside at all meetings, confer with the Executive Director on business and program matters as needed and reports these to the Board of Directors. Shall perform other duties as requested by the Board.

Vice-Chairperson: Shall conduct meetings in the absence of the Chairperson. Shall assist with fund raising. Shall perform other duties as requested by the Chairperson or the Board.

Secretary: Shall review the minutes of all meetings and see that they are mailed in advance of meeting to the Board members. Shall perform other duties as requested by the Board and attend to corporate matters as needed.

Treasurer: Shall present a monthly financial report of income and expenses to the Board. Shall perform other duties as requested by the Board and attend to the corporate matters as needed.

Section 3.

The Chairperson and the Treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to the organization to see that they are deposited into the designated bank account. Expense checks are to be signed by two of the following: Board Chair, Executive Director or Treasurer. All non-budgeted items over \$500 must be approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII
COMMITTEES

Committees shall be created and approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The Executive Director shall cause the CASA program to keep, in an organized form, records as to the program's committees, their duties, and the committee members. The information shall reference the date on which the Board created the committees and approved its membership and functions.

ARTICLE IX

Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of this organization.
