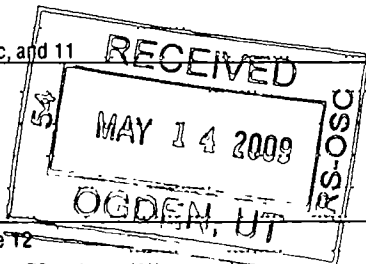

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Corporation shall be to provide service in the fields of parent - child guidance, counseling, psychotherapy and such other social service programs as the Board of Directors may from time to time establish or approve.

These services shall promote healthy child and adolescent development, family functioning and community economic development in low-income, high need communities in Los Angeles County including, but not limited to, the northeast San Fernando Valley, Antelope Valley, Compton, Carson and South Central Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERS

Section 1. Unless and until this Section 1 of Article II of these Bylaws is amended to provide otherwise, there shall be no members of the Corporation, as the term "member" is defined in Section 5056 of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law.

ARTICLE III

DIRECTORS

Section 1. **POWERS.** The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of the Board of Directors. The Board may delegate the management of the day-to-day operation of the business of the Corporation. Without prejudice to such general powers, but subject to the same limitations, it is hereby expressly declared that the Board shall have the following powers in addition to the other powers enumerated in these Bylaws:

- a). To select and remove the Executive Director, prescribe the powers and duties therefor and periodically review the performance thereof.
- b). To conduct, manage, and control the affairs and business of the Corporation and to make such rules and regulations therefor not inconsistent with law, or with the Articles of incorporation, or these Bylaws, as they may deem best.

Section 2. **NUMBER AND QUALIFICATIONS.** The authorized number of Directors shall be thirty-one (31). At no time shall more than forty-nine percent (49%) of all persons serving on the Board of Directors be "interested persons" as that term is defined under California Law.

Section 3. ANNUAL MEETING. The annual meeting of directors shall be held in the month of May pursuant to Section 7 of the Article III or on such other date as shall be designated by the Board of Directors. At such meeting directors shall be elected, and any other business as may be properly brought before the meeting may be transacted.

Section 4. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE. A Director's initial term shall be one (1) year; provided, however, that if a Director is not elected at an Annual Meeting, the initial term shall expire at the Annual Meeting next following the expiration of such one year period. Upon expiration of a Director's initial term, such Director may be re-elected for up to two (2) additional terms of three (3) years each or until his or her successor is elected. A Director who has served the maximum term may be re-elected to the Board after a one-year absence, to serve up to two (2) additional terms of three (3) years each.

Section 5. REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS. Any director who is absent from three consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors or who fails to make a financial contribution to the corporation for any fiscal year while such person is a member of the corporation's Board of Directors may be removed if such absence shall not have been for a valid purpose and if such removal is approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors of the Corporation attending the meeting at which such vote is taken. Two-thirds (2/3) of the directors then in office may remove a director from the Board for any reason.

Section 6. VACANCIES. Vacancies that occur between annual meetings may be filled from among the nominees or nominee selected by the Board Development Committee and elected by a majority of the remaining directors, even though less than a quorum, and each director so elected shall hold office until expiration of the term for which such director is elected.

Section 7. REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETINGS. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at noon on the fourth Thursday of January, March, May, July, and September and the first Thursday in December or any other date(s) or time(s) as the Board may determine.

Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose may be called at any time by the President or any five (5) directors. Notice of the time of special meetings shall be given to the directors at least three (3) days prior to the meeting.

Regular and special meetings of the Board shall be held at the fourth floor conference room of Royal Dongguk University, 440 Shatto Place, Los Angeles, California 90020 or any other place in Los Angeles County as the Board may determine.

Section 8. ACTION AT MEETING: QUORUM AND REQUIRED VOTE. Presence of not less than seven (7) directors at a meeting of the Board of Directors constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise provided herein, every act or decision done or made by a majority vote of the directors present at a meeting duly held at which a quorum is present is the act of the Board of Directors, unless a greater number is required by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws.

Section 9. ACTION WITHOUT MEETING. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting, if all members of the Board shall individually or collectively consent in writing to that action or if all the following conditions are met::

(a) the corporation distributes a written ballot to every Director entitled to vote on the particular matter(s), which ballot and any related material(s) may be sent by e-mail;

(b) the ballot sets forth the proposed action(s), the number of responses needed to meet the quorum requirement, the number and/or percentage of approvals required to take the particular action, and provides an opportunity to specify approval or disapproval of any proposal and a reasonable time within which the ballot must be returned to and received by the corporation;

(c) the number of votes cast within the time period specified equals or exceeds the quorum required to be present at a meeting authorizing the action; and

(d) the number of approvals equals or exceeds the number of votes required to approve such action at a meeting at which the number of votes cast was the same as the number of votes cast by ballot.

Section 10. HONORARY DIRECTORS. The Board of Directors may appoint an unlimited number of Honorary Directors to provide recognition of the contributions of such Honorary Directors to the welfare of the Corporation. Honorary Directors shall not have the right to vote and their appointment shall be at the will of the Board of Directors.

Section 11. COMPENSATION AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST. Directors shall not be entitled to receive any compensation for their services as Directors. Nothing herein shall preclude a Director from performing services for the corporation in other capacities and receiving compensation therefor provided that such compensation conforms to the requirements and limitations of Sections 5227 and 5233 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law and applicable provisions of Federal law or any successor provisions of such laws.

Directors shall disclose to the Board any financial or other material interests in any transaction affecting the corporation. If such transaction is subject to the Board's approval, the interested Director shall not participate in the vote of the Board regarding such transaction. The reasonableness of the compensation and other benefits provided to "disqualified persons," as defined in the Internal Revenue Code, is subject to the Board's approval.

Section 12. DIRECTORS' FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS. Each director shall make a financial contribution to the corporation each fiscal year. Failure to do so may result in such director's removal from office pursuant to Section 5 of this Article III.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1. OFFICERS. The officers of the Corporation shall be the president, 2 vice presidents, secretary, and chief financial officer . The Corporation may also have such other officers as may be appointed by the Board of Directors. All officers shall be directors.

Section 2. ELECTIONS. The officers of the Corporation shall be chosen annually by the Board of Directors, from among its number, and each shall hold his or her office at the pleasure of the Board of Directors, who may, either at a regular or special meeting, remove any such officer and appoint his or her successor.

Section 3. VACANCIES. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or any other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these Bylaws for regular appointments to such office.

Section 4. PRESIDENT. The president shall, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have general supervision, direction and control of the business and affairs of the Corporation, and shall appoint chairpersons of the committees of the Board. He or she shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, shall be ex-officio a member of all the standing committees, except the Nominating Committee, shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president of a corporation, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.

Section 5. VICE PRESIDENT. There shall be two vice presidents, a First Vice President and a Second Vice President. In the absence or disability of the president, the First Vice President (or in his absence the Second Vice President) shall perform all the duties of the president, and when so acting shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the president. The vice presidents shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as from time to time may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.

Section 6. SECRETARY. The secretary shall record or cause to be recorded and shall keep a book of minutes at the principal executive office of actions taken at all of the Board of Directors, and its committees. The secretary or his or her designee shall give notice of meetings of the Board of Directors, shall keep the seal of the Corporation and affix said seal to such documents and instruments as may be required, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.

Section 7. CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER. The chief financial officer shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and accounts of the properties and transactions of the Corporation, and shall send or cause to be sent to the directors such financial statements and reports as are required by law, these Bylaws, or the Board. The books of account shall be open to inspection by any director at all reasonable times. The chief financial officer shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, all money and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the Corporation with such depositories as may be designated by the Board, shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Board, shall render to the president and the Board, when requested, an account of all transactions made on behalf of the Corporation and of the financial condition of the Corporation, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.

ARTICLE V

EXECUTIVE AND OTHER COMMITTEES

Section 1. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of not less than seven (7) members of the Board of Directors: the president, 2 vice-presidents, secretary and chief financial officer of the Corporation and neither less than two (2) nor more than four (4) other directors appointed by the president of the Corporation and confirmed by the Board of Directors. The chairperson of the Executive Committee shall be the president of the Corporation. The Executive Committee shall meet from time to time at the call of the president of the Corporation or any two other members of the Executive Committee. Presence of four members, which shall include three of the five above named officers, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

The Executive Committee shall advise and aid the officers and staff of the Corporation, shall act in emergency situations, and shall perform such duties as the Board may direct, except that the Board may not delegate its authority (1) to adopt, amend, or repeal the Bylaws, (2) to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors, (3) to appoint other committees of the Board, or (4) to employ or terminate the employment of the executive director of the Corporation. All actions taken by the Executive Committee shall be reported at the next meeting of the Board immediately following such action.

Section 2. NOMINATING COMMITTEE.

a. Members. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) members of the Board of Directors, three (3) of whom shall be appointed by the president of the Corporation, subject to confirmation by the Board, and two (2) elected by the Board of Directors, not later than the date of the second regular meeting of the Board following its annual meeting. The president, subject to confirmation by the Board, shall designate a chairperson who shall be one of the three (3) members of the Nominating Committee appointed by the president of the Corporation.

The nominating committee shall invite the advice of the president in its deliberations if needed.

b. Duties. The Nominating Committee shall select nominees to serve as officers of the Corporation. The list of nominees shall be agreed upon prior to the date on which notice of the annual meeting is to be given and shall be included in said notice.

c. Meetings. The Nominating Committee shall meet from time to time at the call of the chairperson or any two (2) other members of the Nominating Committee.

Section 3. FINANCE COMMITTEE.

a. Members. The Finance Committee shall consist of the chief financial officer of the Corporation, who shall be chairperson of the Committee, and a minimum of three (3) other members of the Board of Directors who shall be appointed by the president of the Corporation, subject to confirmation by the Board.

b. Duties. The Finance Committee shall oversee and make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding all financial matters.

c. Meetings. The Finance Committee shall meet from time to time, but not less frequently than bi-monthly, at the call of the chairperson or any two (2) other members of the Committee.

Section 4. HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE.

a. Members. The Human Resources Committee shall consist of a minimum of four (4) members of the Board of Directors who shall be appointed by the president of the Corporation, subject to confirmation by the Board. The president, subject to confirmation by the Board, shall designate the chairperson of the committee.

b. Duties. The Human Resources Committee shall concern itself with the well-being of the Corporation's staff members. Together with the Corporation's executive director, it shall formulate in writing and advise the Board of Directors regarding the personnel standards, practices and procedures of the Corporation. Periodically, but at least annually, the Human Resources Committee shall recommend to the Board appropriate compensation and other terms of employment of the executive director of the Corporation.

c. Meetings. The Human Resources Committee shall meet from time to time at the call of the chairperson or any two (2) other members of the committee.

Section 5. BOARD DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE.

a. Members. The Board Development Committee shall consist of not less than three (3) nor more than seven (7) members of the Board of Directors who shall be appointed by the president of the Corporation, subject to confirmation by the Board. The president, subject to confirmation by the Board, shall designate the chairperson of the Committee.

b. Duties. The Board Development Committee shall select nominees for election to the Board and shall provide appropriate training for Board members.

c. Meetings. The Board Development Committee shall meet from time to time, but not less frequently than quarterly, at the call of the chairperson or any two (2) other members of the Committee.

Section 6. SPECIAL COMMITTEES. The president shall, subject to confirmation by the board, appoint one or more special committees as the Board of Directors may establish by resolution from time to time, each consisting of three or more directors. The Board may delegate to such special committees any of the authority of the Board except the authority (1) to adopt, amend, or repeal these Bylaws, (2) to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors, (3) to appoint other committees of the Board, or (4) to engage or terminate the engagement of the Corporation's executive director.

ARTICLE VI
INDEMNIFICATION

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. For the purposes of this Article VI, "agent" means any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or other agent of the corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise; "proceeding" means any threatened, pending or completed action or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative; and "expenses" includes without limitation attorneys' fees and any expenses of establishing a right to indemnification under Section 4 or 5(b) of this Article VI.

Section 2. INDEMNIFICATION IN ACTIONS BY THIRD PARTIES. The corporation shall have power to indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any proceeding (other than an action by or in the right of the corporation to procure a judgment in its favor, an action brought under Section 5233 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, or an action brought by the Attorney General or a person granted relator status by the Attorney General for any breach of duty relating to assets held in charitable trust) by reason of the fact that such person is or was an agent of the corporation, against expenses, judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred in connection with such proceeding if such person acted in good faith and in a manner such person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the corporation and, in the case of a criminal proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe the conduct of such person was unlawful. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which the person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the corporation or that the person had reasonable cause to believe that the person's conduct was unlawful.

Section 3. INDEMNIFICATION IN ACTIONS BY OR IN THE RIGHT OF THE CORPORATION. The corporation shall have the power to indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action by or in the right of the corporation, or brought under Section 5233 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, or brought by the Attorney General or a person granted relator status by the Attorney General for breach of duty relating to assets held in charitable trust, to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was an agent of the corporation, against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement of such action if such person acted in good faith, in a manner such person believed to be in the best interests of the corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.

No indemnification shall be made under this Section 3:

(a) In respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable to the corporation in the performance of such person's duty to the corporation, unless and only to the extent that the court in which such proceeding is or was pending shall determine upon application that, in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for the expenses which such court shall determine;

(b) Of amounts paid in settling or otherwise disposing of a threatened or pending action, with or without court approval; or

(c) Of expenses incurred in defending a threatened or pending action which is settled or otherwise disposed of without court approval, unless it is settled with the approval of the Attorney General.

Section 4. INDEMNIFICATION AGAINST EXPENSES. To the extent that an agent of the corporation has been successful on the merits in defense of any proceeding referred to in Sections 2 or 3 of this Article VI or in defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, the agent shall be indemnified against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by the agent in connection therewith.

Section 5. REQUIRED DETERMINATIONS. Except as provided in Section 4 of this Article VI any indemnification under this Article VI shall be made by the corporation only if authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the agent is proper under the circumstances because the agent has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 2 or 3 of this Article VI by:

(a) A majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who are not parties to such proceeding; or

(b) The court in which such proceeding is or was pending upon application made by the corporation or the agent or the attorney or other person rendering services in connection with the defense, whether or not such application by the agent, attorney or other person is opposed by the corporation.

Section 6. ADVANCE OF EXPENSES. Expenses incurred in defending any proceeding may be advanced by the corporation prior to the final disposition of such proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the agent to repay such amount unless it shall be determined ultimately that the agent is entitled to be indemnified as authorized in this Article VI. The provisions of subdivision (a) of Section 5236 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law do not apply to advances made pursuant to this section of the bylaws of the corporation.

Section 7. OTHER INDEMNIFICATION. No provision made by the corporation to indemnify its Directors, officers or employees for the defense of any proceeding shall be valid unless consistent with this Article V. Nothing contained in this Article VI shall affect any right to indemnification to which persons other than such directors, officers and employees may be entitled by contract or otherwise.

Section 8. FORMS OF INDEMNIFICATION NOT PERMITTED. No indemnification or advance shall be made under this Article VI, except as provided in Sections 4 or 5(b), in any circumstances where it appears:

(a) That it would be inconsistent with a provision of the articles of incorporation, these bylaws, or any agreement in effect at the time of the accrual of the alleged cause of action asserted in the proceeding in which the expenses were incurred or other amounts were paid, which prohibits or otherwise limits indemnification; or

(b) That it would be inconsistent with any conditions expressly imposed by a court in approving a settlement.

Section 9. INSURANCE. The corporation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent of the corporation against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or alleged capacity or arising out of the agent's status or alleged status as such whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify the agent against such liability under the provisions of this Article VI, provided, however, that the corporation shall have no power to purchase and maintain such insurance to indemnify any agent of the corporation for a violation of Section 5233 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law.

Section 10. NONAPPLICABILITY TO FIDUCIARIES OF EMPLOYEE BENEFIT PLANS. This Article VI does not apply to any proceeding against any director, investment manager or other fiduciary of an employee benefit plan in such person's capacity as such, even though such person may also be an agent of the corporation as defined in Section 1 of this Article VI. The corporation shall have power to indemnify, and to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of, such Director, investment manager or other fiduciary to the extent permitted by subdivision (f) of Section 207 of the California General Corporation Law.

ARTICLE VII

MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. RULES OF ORDER. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised, shall govern all directors' meetings, subject to the rules of order set forth in the applicable law, the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws.

Section 2. FISCAL YEAR. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be from July 1 to June 30.

Section 3. BOOKS AND RECORDS. The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and also shall keep minutes of the proceedings of the Board and committees of the Board.

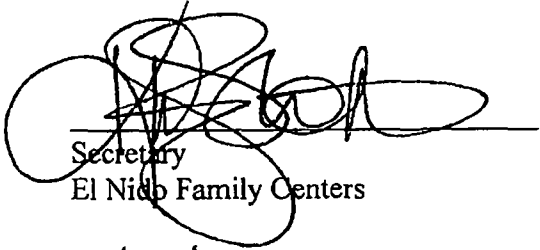
ARTICLE VIII

AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

Section 1. BY DIRECTORS. Subject to applicable law and to the Articles of Incorporation, these Bylaws may be adopted, amended or repealed by the Board of Directors. Such adoption, amendment or repeal shall be proposed to the Board by a special committee of the Board of Directors established for that purpose, but no such adoption, amendment or repeal may be enacted until the earlier of the expiration of 30 days after such proposal is made or the next Board meeting after such proposal is made.

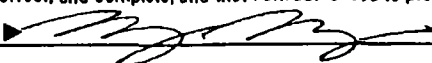
