<p>2008-09 EDUCATION INITIATIVES United Way of New York City's work in Education focuses on helping students overcome barriers to attending school and providing them with youth development and skill building opportunities to ensure credentialing for further education or entry into the workforce. For examples of our initiatives, see schedule O Community Achievement Project in the Schools (CAPS) - CAPS enhances student attendance and academic performance. Students attending low performing schools, the majority of which are located in low-income communities, receive comprehensive attendance improvement services including counseling, family involvement and daily attendance monitoring. Students are also helped to identify barriers to success, and to develop goals to overcome those barriers. During the 2008-2009 school year, CAPS served 10,688 youth while the target enrollment for the year was 9,280. United Way Partners 43 community-based organizations and 100 New York City public schools Focus Forward - provides academic support, youth development programs, and higher education/career exploration activities during after-school hours at selected CAPS schools to 781 students. Activities and projects result in increased knowledge, improved attitude, skills acquisition, and/or cultural/creative competence. Focus Forward is one of the few after-school programs in the City that improves the graduation rate of youth most at risk of dropping out by enabling them to earn additional credits towards diploma requirements. Of the 781 students served in Focus Forward during the 2008-2009 school year, 416 were high school students who successfully recovered credits towards graduation requirements. United Way Partners 34 community-based organizations/Professional Development Exchange - UWN NYC developed the Professional Development Exchange (PDE) to address the special skills needed by community-based organizations (CBOs) working with at-risk youth in NYC schools. PDE provides in-depth skills trainings on youth development, case management, supervision and family engagement strategies to CBO staff working with students who participate in United Way programs. Ninety-three (93) CBO staff were trained in the 2008-2009 fiscal year through PDE. United Way Partners Good Shepherd Services and Visiting Nurse Service of New York 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) UWN NYC's specialized 21st CCLC programs are comprised of partnerships between three New York City Department of Education Alternative High Schools that work with over-age and under-credited youth and three community-based organizations with a common goal of providing credit recovery programs through credit-bearing, academic enrichment and youth development activities. Family involvement and literacy programs support economic independence, and thus, support student efforts to earn a high school diploma, which is the basic credentialing for advanced education and stable employment. This year a total of 340 students participated in the 21st CCLC program. At Lower East Side Prep, in particular, 204 students were served. Of those 204, 186 students earned credits towards graduation, and 66 students graduated. United Way Partners include Lower East Side Preparatory High School and the Chinese American Planning Council, Community Prep and Sports and Arts in Schools, and Brooklyn Academy High School and CAMBA, Inc Quality New York - Quality New York's (QNY) participating child care and early education programs, the majority of which are located in marginalized communities, receive comprehensive services including assessment, training, technical assistance and support to help them achieve the enhanced level of quality required to attain and retain accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). The overall goal of this program is to create a system wide infrastructure that ensures continuous quality improvement in early education services. QNY has engaged and supported 105 centers serving approximately 10,000 children in pursuit of continuous quality improvement, 31 centers have received quality improvement services at the intensive level, which includes on-site, tailored technical assistance, professional development services, and participation in the peer network group, 13 centers achieved NAEYC accreditation during the fiscal year, 16 centers have submitted candidacy reports to NAEYC and will receive a determination before 2010, and, 20 centers pursuing re-accreditation under the new NAEYC standards received accreditation facilitation services through the QNY Institute for Accredited programs. United Way Partners Bank Street College of Education, Child Care, Inc., Federation of Protestant Welfare Agencies IMPACT - IMPACT is a model neighborhood-based family resource center located in Bushwick, Brooklyn and staffed by community residents, that provides leadership development, child development supports, family literacy, and assistance meeting whole family needs. In 2008-2009, 424 children and parents participated in literacy activities two times or more, 152 literacy activities were offered, 185 families were supported in finding childcare (62 confirmed enrolled), 302 families received referrals to social services, and 14 Born Learning Parent Ambassadors were trained to carry out peer-to-peer outreach. United Way Partner Agenda for Children Tomorrow Child Care and Early Education Fund (CCEEF) - This Fund is a collaborative effort by private funders and public sector representatives focused on achieving systemic improvements in the quantity, quality and accessibility of early education services through collaborative grant making. CCEEF informs and strengthens City/State policies and systems regarding funding, contracting, and assessment of early care and education programs. It also focuses its efforts to enhance quality improvement mechanisms, with a focus on professional development, successful program models, and community outreach approaches. The fund awarded three grants in fiscal year 2008-2009 to the following partners: NYC Early Childhood Professional Development Institute, BUILD, and QUALITYstarsNY Professional Development Institute. In 2004, the Child Care and Early Education Fund and UWN NYC established the CUNY Early Childhood Professional Development Institute (PDI) to coordinate career development services for early education staff. UWN NYC works with PDI to develop and implement plans to increase the number of certified early education teachers in CBOs, address the salary disparity issue and create targeted programs to enhance the professional development, and career advancement of early education professionals. During the 2008-2009 fiscal year, PDI developed a plan for an electronic staff registry for professional development. Additionally 85 students enrolled in the Children's Program Administration Credential (state-recognized credentialing for early childhood center directors) courses and received related one-on-one support. PDI also redesigned a webpage featuring resources for the Early Childcare Education (ECE) community which receives 6,000 visits each month. PDI is also responsible for the writing and dissemination of two policy briefs on issues affecting the early childhood sector (i.e. economic downturn, State field test on quality improvement systems).</p>

<p>2008-09 INCOME INITIATIVES United Way of New York City's work in Income focuses on supporting the efforts of New Yorkers to gain and sustain assets, increasing income supports, and enabling workers to secure and maintain gainful employment. For examples of our initiatives, see schedule O MONEYUP - MoneyUP increases clients' income through the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), and helps them build savings and assets through one-on-one financial counseling, including but not limited to access to mainstream banking, debt reduction, and credit counseling. In 2008-2009, MoneyUP volunteers and staff prepared 1,870 tax returns totaling \$1,345,346 in federal refunds and a total of \$2,045,652 to the client community. 47 clients purchased US Savings Bonds with tax refunds for a total of assets saved equaling \$19,125 - approximately \$407 per refund saved toward a financial goal. Youth Financial Empowerment - The Youth Financial Empowerment Initiative supports youths aging out of foster care in making a successful transition to adulthood by providing the opportunity to participate in a matched savings account program. This comprehensive program incorporates financial education and goal-setting, workforce development, access to benefits and housing, and mentoring. This program was piloted during 2008-2009. In that year, 46 youth completed the financial literacy training and 25 of those youth opened IDA accounts. United Way Partners FECS, Mentoring USA, NYC Administration for Children's Services, NYC's Center for Economic Opportunity, New Yorkers for Children, Wells Fargo, Women's Center for Education and Career Advancement Food Card Access Project (FCAP) - FCAP facilitates and improves NYC residents' access to Food Stamps. Community-based organizations conduct grassroots outreach with specialized computer software created by United Way of New York City to increase awareness, and work with individuals to determine potential eligibility, assist with the application and documentation process, schedule appointments with HRA, and advocate if barriers are encountered. Since its inception in 2003, over 125,000 people have enrolled in Food Stamps through the FCAP program. This number accounts for a minimum of \$129 million in Food Stamps dollars allotted to clients, resulting in at least \$238 million in activity for the city. Earn Benefits - Earn Benefits is an online case management tool and benefit eligibility calculator used by a network of 15 community-based organizations to promote job retention and greater economic self-sufficiency by helping low-wage workers gain access to work supports like childcare, Medicaid and Food Stamps. In 2008-2009, 9,560 clients were screened for benefits, 9,125 clients were found eligible for benefits, 8,866 clients were referred for benefits, and, 9,836 clients enrolled in 1 or more benefit(s). United Way Lead Partner Seedco EarnFair Alliance - The EarnFair Alliance is a network of community-based organizations operating workforce development programs that provide vital education and training to clients across specific New York City neighborhoods. Through EarnFair's Back to Work Program in 2008-2009, 7,905 people were helped to create pre-employment plans. Another 1,443 participants were placed in jobs. United Way Lead Partner Seedco Emergency Food & Shelter Program (EFSP) - EFSP prevents hunger and preserves shelter of New Yorkers facing economic emergencies, by providing funding and technical support. To ensure the best providers in each underserved geographical area reach people struggling to maintain self-sufficiency, agencies are trained and monitored throughout the year. Last year, EFSP supported 213 agencies serving New Yorkers through pantries, kitchens, shelters and eviction prevention assistance. EFSP funds provided 1 million hot meals, 1.3 million meals distributed through grocery bags or vouchers, 1,837 rent or mortgage arrears to households facing eviction, 516 utilities arrears and 946 nights of shelter. Housing Help Program - The Housing Help Program offers integrated legal, social and financial services to families in the court system and the community through a team comprised of a lawyer and a social worker that assess the family's need and the most appropriate approach. HHP is proven as an innovative and effective way to prevent an immediate eviction as well as homelessness and recidivism over time. In 2008-2009, 869 HHP clients were identified as needing at least one primary social service, 374 clients received at least 1 hour of social work services, and 87 clients received 10 or more hours of social work services. United Way Partners Adult Protective Services, Bronx Civil Court of the City of New York, Department of Homeless Services, Department of Housing Preservation and Development, Legal Aid Services for New York City, NYC Human Resources Administration, and Women in Need My Door - My Door helps survivors of domestic violence by addressing the interrelated economic, social, legal and housing challenges faced of survivors transitioning from shelter to building new lives. In the 2008-2009 fiscal year, 81 families enrolled in the My Door program and 70 children successfully avoided foster care. Sixty-eight (68) families maintained permanent housing. United Way Partners NYC Human Resource Administration, Office of Domestic Violence and Emergency Intervention Services, Office of the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services, Sanctuary for Families, and Seedco Neighborhood Opportunities Fund - The Neighborhood Opportunities Fund (NOF) seeks to support the preservation and production of sustainable, affordable housing and the development of economic opportunities and community facilities for New York City's low and moderate income residents. NOF works to support the equitable development of place-based strategies ensure the goals of the Economic Opportunities Commission and PlaNYC 2030 (a long-term vision for creating a sustainable New York City) are equitably implemented, and build organizational capacity at the grass roots level. In fiscal year 2008-2009, NOF donors selected a set of organizations and committed \$1.81 billion to support the production and preservation of sustainable, affordable housing as well as ensuring a meaningful voice for neighborhood residents in addressing emerging citywide and community issues. Rent Arrears and Utilities Hotline - This hotline provides NYC households across the five boroughs with advice and referrals to assist them in resolving their housing crises. The Hotline helps New York City resident's access charitable contributions to help them pay their rent/mortgage and utility arrears when they have a housing crisis. In fiscal year 2008-2009 the hotline received 16,143 calls, which is 2,543 more callers than in 2007-2008. <p>2008-09 HEALTH & OTHER INITIATIVES United Way of New York City's work in health focuses on increasing health care opportunities for un-served and underserved populations, decreasing chronic health diagnoses, such as diabetes and obesity, and increasing New Yorker's access to nutritious food and information on how to remain healthy. UWN NYC also work in Strengthening New York City Nonprofits focuses on improving the capacity and quality of board and professional staff leadership at NYC nonprofits, especially those organizations that are instrumental in achieving the goals of UWN NYC Action Areas. Additionally, UWN NYC works to enhance the organizational performance of NYC nonprofits, especially those that are instrumental in achieving the goals of UWN NYC's Action Areas, by providing them with the tools, systems and practices required for improved service delivery. Examples of our initiatives are Breast Health Awareness Initiative, The American Cancer Society, American Heart Association and United Way of New York City have partnered around three pillars: policy/advocacy, patient navigation, and community-based care. In 2007, UWN NYC partnered with Community Healthcare Network (CHN) in an innovative breast-cancer outreach and screening project to fulfill the community-based care aspect of the partnership. During 2008-2009, CHN provided breast health education to 599 women through one-on-one education, workshops, presentations, and health fairs. United Way Partners The American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, Community Healthcare Network. The Women and Families HIV/AIDS Initiative is a public-private partnership between the New York State Department of Health/ AIDS Institute and United Way of New York City. The program objective is to provide case management and supportive services to women infected with HIV/AIDS and their families living in the hardest hit areas throughout New York City. United Way of New York City serves as fiscal conduit for the Women & Families HIV/AIDS initiative and also provides technical assistance to partner agencies. In 2008-2009, 675 women and their families were served throughout the Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens, accessing nearly 12,000 supportive services including support groups, health education and transportation services. Hunger Prevention and Nutrition Assistance Program (HPNAP) - HPNAP is dedicated to improving the health and nutritional status of New Yorkers by providing emergency food providers with support and grants for equipment, operations and food, which must include at least 15% spending on fresh produce and nutrition programs. In the 2008-2009 fiscal year, the 387 agencies receiving HPNAP Food and Operations Support Grants served 7,901,201 meals. HPNAP agencies exceeded UWN NYC's requirement, using 22% of their funding on fresh produce. Nonprofit Leadership Development Institute (Including Junior, Senior, Executive Fellows and Linkages) - In 2004, United Way of New York City established the Nonprofit Leadership Development Institute (NLDI) in partnership with Baruch College in response to the serious leadership deficit afflicting the nonprofit sector in New York. The Institute aims to build a pipeline of well-trained individuals who will assume greater leadership responsibilities in the coming years at a wide and cross-section of NYC nonprofit organizations. NLDI includes three education and training programs: Junior Fellows targets early-career professionals working at NYC nonprofits, Senior Fellows targets high performing, mid-career nonprofit professionals, and Executive Fellows targets Executive Directors and C-level professionals (CEOs, COOs, etc.). In the 2008-2009 fiscal year, five executive fellows, 10 senior fellows and 24 junior fellows participated in the program. Another component of NLDI, the Linkages Board Training and Placement program, provides comprehensive board governance training to diverse groups of business professionals, who are then linked to local nonprofits as prospective board members. NLDI also manages the New Leaders' Network, which offers ongoing professional development opportunities to all Program participants and alumni, addressing critical trends within the nonprofit sector. In 2008-2009, 147 individuals were trained to become Board members. Of these, 63 people were placed on Boards. Organizational Support Services - Organizational Support Services provides direct technical assistance designed to help the nonprofit address a strategic or operational matter, including legal issues, financial systems, fundraising plans, operational planning and management, and technology. In the 2008-2009 fiscal year, 22 nonprofits received direct technical assistance through one-on-one consulting engagements. Pfizer Corporate Social Responsibility Initiative is a partnership between UWN NYC and Pfizer, Inc. This partnership responds directly to the partners' desire to mitigate the impact of the closing of one of Pfizer's large manufacturing facilities in East Williamsburg, Brooklyn by funding technical assistance and leadership development services for local community-based organizations operating in the neighborhoods most affected by the plant closure. Through this partnership, five nonprofits in East Williamsburg and other neighborhoods surrounding Pfizer's decommissioned manufacturing facility received technical assistance through one-on-one consulting engagements. TARGETED IMPACT FUND GRANTS UWN NYC's Targeted Impact Fund invests resources in projects, programs and nonprofits that are well-aligned with and can demonstrate the ability to significantly increase the success of the UWN NYC community impact strategy. In 2008-2009, UWN NYC administered 27 grants to community-based organizations throughout New York City through the Targeted Impact Fund, totaling \$876,525.</p>
