**RESTATED BYLAWS OF
I LOVE A CLEAN SAN DIEGO**

**ARTICLE I
OFFICES OF THE CORPORATION**

Section 1.1 Principal Office. The principal Office for the transaction of the activities and affairs of the Corporation ("Principal Office") is located at 4891 Pacific Highway, Suite 115, San Diego, California, 92110, in San Diego County, California. The Board of Director (the "Board") may change the Principal Office from the one location another. Any change of location of the Principal Office shall be noted by the secretary on these Bylaws opposite this section, or this section may be amended to state the new location.

Section 1.2 Other Offices. The Board may at any time establish branch or subordinate offices at any place or places where the Corporation is qualified to conduct its activities.

**ARTICLE II
PURPOSES AND LIMITATIONS**

Section 2.1 General Purposes. The purpose of the Corporation is to operate, educate, and empower people to act in ways that are both economically viable and ecologically sustainable.

Section 2.2 Specific Purposes. The Corporation is a nonprofit organization organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any subsequent federal tax law. The purpose for which the Corporation is formed is for the (a) advancement, promotion and fostering of recycling, resource conservation and waste reduction throughout the County of San Diego, California, (b) dedication to the conservation of natural resources by preventing litter, encouraging recycling, and (c) promoting the responsible management of waste through education, research and direct action in both the public and private sectors in order to create balance among competing demands on our environment. As a means of accomplishing the foregoing purposes, the Corporation shall have the power to do any and all acts as are necessary or conducive to the attainment of any of the objects and purposes herein before set forth, to the same extent and as fully as any natural person might or could do; provided, however, that notwithstanding any provision of the Articles

of Incorporation or any provision of applicable state law to the contrary, the Corporation shall not have the power to carry on any activities which would cause it to fail to qualify, as (a) an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law, or (b) any organization contributions which are deductible under Sections 170, 2055 and 2522 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law. The Corporation shall be authorized to solicit, receive and administer funds for the above purposes, but the Corporation shall not be authorized to accept gifts or contributions for other than the purpose herein before stated. The funds of the Corporation shall not be restricted in use to the people of any race, faith, color, or creed, but such funds shall be administered on a nondiscriminatory basis.

Section 2.3 Non-Partisan Activities. This Corporation has been formed under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for the charitable purposes described above, and it shall be non-profit and non-partisan. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of the publication or dissemination of materials with the purpose of attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. The Corporation shall not, except in an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purpose described above.

Section 2.4 Dedication of Assets. The properties and assets of this non-profit Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes. No part of the net earnings, properties, or assets of this Corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual, or any Member or director of this Corporation. On liquidation or dissolution, all properties and assets and obligations shall be distributed and paid over to an organization dedicated to charitable purposes, provided that the organization continues to be dedicated to the exempt purposes as specified in Internal Revenue Section 501(c)(3).

Section 2.5 Qualifications and Rights of Membership. The Corporation shall have one class of Members, designated as non-voting. The classes of membership shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Any membership, regardless of class, may be referred to as a "Membership." Persons or entities holding any class of Membership are referred to as herein as "Members." Any person dedicated to the purposes of this Corporation and by payment of dues shall be eligible for Membership on approval by the Board of a Membership application and upon timely payment of such dues, fees and assessments as the Board may fix from time to time. Individuals and businesses shall be Members for one year. Renewal of Membership shall be automatic with the payment of dues.

ARTICLE III

DIRECTORS

Section 3.1 Powers.

3.1.1 General Corporate Powers. Subject to the provisions and limitations of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law and any other applicable laws, and subject to any limitations of the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws regarding actions that require approval of the Members, the Corporation's activities and affairs shall be managed, and all corporate powers shall be exercised, by or under the direction of the Board.

3.1.2 Specific Powers. Without prejudice to the general powers set forth in Section 4.1.1 above, but subject to the same limitations, the directors shall have the power to:

(a) Appoint and remove, at the pleasure of the Board, all the Corporation's officers, agents, and employees; prescribe powers and duties for them that are consistent with law, with the Articles of Incorporation, and with these Bylaws.

(b) Change the Principal Office or the principal business office in California from one location to another; cause the Corporation to be qualified to conduct its activities in any other state, territory, dependency, or country and conduct its activities within or outside California.

(c) Adopt and use a corporate seal and alter the forms of the seal.

(d) Borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the Corporation and cause to be executed and delivered for the Corporation's purposes, in the corporate name, promissory notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of trust, mortgages, pledges, hypothecation, and other evidences of debt and securities.

(e) Fix or change the authorized number of directors;

(f) Fix or change the minimum or maximum number of directors; or

(g) Change from a fixed number of directors to a variable number of directors or vice versa.

Section 3.2 Number and Qualification of Directors.

3.2.1 Authorized Number and Qualifications. The Board of Directors shall consist of at least seven (7) but not more than twenty-five (25) directors until changed by amendment to these Bylaws. The exact number of directors shall be fixed, within those limits, by a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors.

3.2.2 Restriction in Interested Persons as Directors. No more than forty-nine percent (49%) of the persons serving on the Board may be interested persons. An interested person is (a) any person compensated by the Corporation for services rendered to it within the previous twelve (12) months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a director as director; and (b) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendant, spouse, brother-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of such person. However, any violation of the provisions of this paragraph shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any transaction entered into by the Corporation.

Section 3.3 Election, Designation, and Term of Office. Directors shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Members, to hold office for two years. However, if any such directors are not elected at any annual meeting, they may be elected at any special meeting of Members held for that purpose or by written ballot. Each such director, including a director elected to fill a vacancy or elected at a special meeting of Members or by written ballot, shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which elected and until a successor has been elected and qualified. Directors may not serve more than two consecutive two-year terms. This provision, however, may be over-ridden by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors.

3.4.1 Events Causing Vacancy. A vacancy or vacancies on the Board shall exist on the occurrence of the following: (a) the death or resignation of any director; (b) the declaration by resolution of the Board of a vacancy in the office of a director who has been declared of unsound mind by an order of court, convicted of a felony, or found by final order of judgment of any court to have breached a duty under Article 3 Chapter 2 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law (c) the increase of the authorized number of directors; or (d) the failure of the Members, at any meeting of Members at which any director or directors are to be elected, to elect the number of directors required to be elected at such meeting.

3.4.2 Resignations. Except as provided below, any director may resign by giving written notice to the chairman of the Board, if any, or to the president or the secretary of the Board. The resignation shall be effective when the notice is given unless it specifies a later time for the resignation to become effective. If a director's resignation is effective at a later time, the Board may elect a successor to take office as of the date when the resignation becomes effective. Except on notice to the Attorney General of California, no director may resign if the Corporation would be left without a duly elected director or directors.

3.4.3 Filling Vacancies. Except for a vacancy created by the removal of a director, vacancies on the Board may be filled by a majority of the directors then in office, whether or not less than a quorum, or by a sole remaining director.

3.4.4 No Vacancy on Reduction of Number of Directors. No reduction of the authorized number of directors shall have the effect of removing any director before that director's term of office expires.

Section 3.5 Directors Meetings

3.5.1 Place of Meetings. Meetings of the Board shall be held at any place within or outside California that has been designation by resolution of the Board or in the notice of the meeting or, if not so designation, at the Principal Office of the Corporation. Special meetings of the Board shall be held at any place within or outside the State of California that has been designation in the notice of the meeting or, if not stated in the notice, or if there is no notice, at the Principal Office of the Corporation. Notwithstanding the above provisions, a regular or special meeting of the Board may be held at any place consented to in writing by all the Board Members, either before or after the meeting. If consents are given, they shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting.

3.5.2 Meeting's by Telephone. Any meeting may be held by conference telephone or similar communication equipment, as long as all directors participating in the meeting can hear one another. All such directors shall be deemed to present in person at such meeting.

3.5.3 Annual Meeting. An annual meeting of the Board shall be held for the purposes of organization, election of officers, and transaction of other business. Notice of this meeting is required.

3.5.4 Other Regular Meetings. Other regular meeting of the Board may be held without notice as such time and place as the Board may fix from time to time.

3.5.5 Special Meetings.

(a) **Authority to Call.** Special meetings of the Board for any purpose may be called at any time by the chairman of the Board, if any, the president of any vice president, or the secretary or any two directors.

(b) **Notice.**

(1) **Manner of Giving Notice.** Notice of the time and place of special meetings shall be given to each director by one of the following methods: (i) by personal delivery of written notice; (ii) by first-class mail, postage prepaid; or (iii) by telephone, including a voice messaging system or other system or technology designed to record and communicate messages, telegraph, facsimile, electronic mail, or other electronic means, either directly to the director or to a person at the director's office who would reasonably be expected to communicate that notice promptly to the director. All such notices shall be given or sent to the director's address or telephone number as shown on the records of the Corporation.

(2) **Time Requirements.** Notices sent by first-class mail shall be deposited in the United States mails at least four (4) days before the time set for the meeting. Notices given by personal delivery, telephone, including a voice messaging system or other system or technology designed to record and communicate messages,

telegraph, facsimile, electronic mail, or other electronic means shall be delivered, by any of the above means, at least forty-eight (48) hours before the time set for the meeting.

(3) Notice. The notice shall state the time of the meeting, and the place if the place is other than the Principal Office of the Corporation. It need not specify the purpose of the meeting.

3.5.6 Quorum. A majority of the authorized number of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, except to adjourn. Every action taken or decision made by a majority of the directors present at a duly held meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board, subject to the more stringent provisions of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, including, without limitation, those provisions relating to (i) approval of contracts or transactions in which a director has a direct or indirect material financial interest, (ii) approval of certain transactions between Corporations having common directorships, (iii) creation of and appointments to Committees of the Board, and (iv) indemnification of directors. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business, despite the withdrawal of directors, if any action taken or decision made is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for that meeting.

3.5.7 Waiver of Notice. Notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who, either before or after the meeting, signs a waiver of notice, a written consent to the holding of the meeting, or an approval of the minutes of the meeting. The waiver of notice or consent need not specify the purpose of the meeting. All such waivers, consents, and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meetings. Notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who attends the meeting and does not protest, before or at the commencement of the meeting, the lack of notice to him or her.

3.5.8 Adjournment. A majority of the directors present, whether or not a quorum is present, may adjourn any meeting to another time and place.

3.5.9 Notice of Adjourned Meeting. Notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting need not be given unless the original meeting is adjourned for more than twenty-four (24) hours. If the original meeting is adjourned for more than twenty-four (24) hours, notice of any adjournment to another time and place shall be given, before the time of the adjourned meeting, to the directors who were not present at the time of the adjournment.

Section 3.6 Action Without a Meeting. Any action that the Board is required or permitted to take may be taken without a meeting if all Members of the Board consent in writing to the action; provided, however, that any director who has material financial interest in a transaction to which the Corporation is a party and who is an "interested director" as defined in Section 5233 of the California Corporations Code shall not be entitled to vote on such consent or approval of that transaction. Such action by written

consent shall have the same force and effect as any other validly approved action of the Board. All such consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.

Section 3.7 Compensation and Reimbursement. Directors shall not receive compensation for their services as Directors. However, Directors, officers and committee members may receive such reimbursement of expenses as the Board may determine by resolution to be just and reasonable as to the Corporation at the time that the resolution is adopted.

Section 3.8 Committees.

3.8.1 Committees of the Board. The Board, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, provided a quorum is present, may create one or more committees, each consisting of at least one (1) or more directors and may consist of additional persons who are not directors, to serve at the pleasure of the Board ("Committees of the Board"). Appointments to Committees of the Board shall be by majority vote of the directors then in office. The Board may appoint one (1) or more directors as alternate Members of any such Committee, who may replace any absent Member at any meeting. Any such Committee of the Board, to the extent provided in the Board resolution, shall have all the authority of the Board, except that no committee, regardless of Board resolution, may:

- (a) Take any final action on any matter that, under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law.
- (b) Fill vacancies on the Board or on any committee that has the authority of the Board;
- (c) Amend or repeal Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws;
- (d) Amend or repeal any resolution of the Board that by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (e) Create any other Committee of the Board or appoint the Members of Committees of the Board;
- (f) Approve any contract or transaction to which the Corporation is a party and in which one or more of its directors has a material financial interest, except as special approval is provided for in Section 5233(d)(3) of the California Corporation Code.

3.8.2 Meetings and Actions of Committees of the Board. Meetings and actions of Committees of the Board shall be governed by, held and taken in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws concerning meetings and other Board actions with such changes in the context of these bylaws as are necessary to substitute the Committee of the Board, for the Board of Directors, except that the time for regular meetings of such Committees on the calling of special meeting of such Committees may be determined

either by Board resolution or, if there is none, by resolution of the Committee of the Board. Minutes of each meeting of any Committee of the Board shall be kept and shall be filed with the corporate records and provided to Board Members upon request. The Board may adopt rules for the government of any Committee of the Board, provided they are consistent with these Bylaws or, in the absence of rules adopted by the Board, the committee may adopt such rules.

3.8.3 Particular Board and Advisory Committees. The Bylaws may establish particular committees. The Board cannot, however, delegate the powers listed in Corporations Code Section 311 to any committee.

If any committee does not have any director Members, it is not a "Committee of the Board," and it should be clearly labeled an "advisory committee." Unless the Bylaws provide otherwise, the Board may delegate management of the Corporation's activities to an advisory committee to the same extent that those powers could be delegated to anyone under Corporations Code Section 52100.

3.8.4 Committees.

(a) Establishment. The Board of Directors may establish those committees which it deems necessary. These committees shall have names, powers and duties and existence as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

3.8.5 Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board and at least one other member of the Board appointed by the President. The Executive Committee shall meet as necessary and shall transact the business of the Corporation between meetings of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have, and may exercise the powers of the Board in the interim between Board meetings, except that the Executive Committee shall not have the power to adopt the budget or to take any action which is contrary to, or a substantial departure from, the direction established by the Board or which represents a major change in the affairs, business, or mission of the Corporation. The Executive Committee shall report on actions taken to the Board. The President shall be the Chairperson of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

Section 4.1 Officers of the Corporation. The officers of the Corporation shall be a president, a secretary, and a treasurer. The Corporation may also have, at the Board's discretion, a vice president and such other officers as may be appointed in accordance with these Bylaws. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the secretary nor the treasurer may serve concurrently as either the president.

Section 4.2 Election of Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be chosen annually by the Board.

Section 4.3 Removal of Officers. Without prejudice to any rights of an officer under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed with or without cause by the Board and also, if the officer was not chosen by the Board, by any officer on whom the Board may confer that power of removal.

Section 4.4 Resignation of Officers. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Corporation. The resignation shall take effect as of the date the notice is received or at any later time specified in the notice and, unless otherwise specified in the notice, the resignation need not be accepted to be effective. Any resignation shall be without prejudice to the rights, if any, of the Corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.

Section 4.5 Vacancies in Office. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these Bylaws for regular appointments to that office, provided, however, that vacancies need not be filled on an annual basis.

Section 4.6 Responsibilities of Officers.

4.6.1 President. Subject to such supervisory powers as the Board may give to the Chairman of the Board, if any, and subject to the control of the Board, the president shall be the general manager of the Corporation and shall supervise, direct, and control the Corporation's activities, affairs, and officers. If there is no chairman, the president shall be the chief executive officer. The president shall preside at all meetings of Members and, in the absence of the chairman of the Board, or if there is none, at all Board meetings. The president shall have such other powers and duties as the Board or the Bylaws may prescribe. The president shall be an ex-officio member of all Committees of the Board.

4.6.2 Vice President. If the president is absent or disabled, the vice president, if any, in order of their rank as fixed by the Board, or, if not ranked, a vice president designated by the Board, shall perform all duties of the president. When so acting, a vice president shall have all powers of and be subject to all restrictions on the president. The vice presidents shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as the Board or the Bylaws prescribe.

4.6.3 Secretary.

(a) Book of Minutes. The secretary shall keep or cause to be kept, at the Corporation's Principal Office or such other place as the Board may direct, a book of minutes of all meetings, proceedings, and actions of the Board, of Committees of the Board. The minutes of meetings shall include the time and place that the meeting was held, whether the meeting was annual, regular, or special, and, if special, how authorized,

the notice given, the names of those present at Board and committee meetings. The secretary shall keep or cause to be kept, at the Principal Office in California, a copy of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, as amended to date.

(b) Notices, Seal and Other Duties. The secretary shall give, or cause to be given notice of all meetings of the Board and of Committees of the Board required by these Bylaws to be given. The secretary shall keep the corporate seal in safe custody and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as the Board or the Bylaws may prescribe.

4.6.3 Treasurer.

(a) Books of Account. The treasurer shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and accounts of the Corporation's properties and transactions. The treasurer shall send or cause to be given to the directors such financial statements and reports as are required to be given by law, by these Bylaws, or by the Board. The books of account shall be open to inspection by any director at all reasonable times.

(b) Deposit and Disbursement of Money and Valuables. The treasurer shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, all money and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the Corporation with such depositories as the Board may designate, shall disburse the Corporation's funds as the Board may order, shall render to the president, chairman of the Board, if any, and the Board, when requested, an account of all transactions as treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as the Board or the Bylaws may prescribe.

(c) Bond. If required by the Board, the treasurer shall give the Corporation a bond in the amount and with the surety or sureties specified by the Board for faithful performance of the duties of the office and for restoration to the Corporation of all its books, paper, voucher, money, and other property of every kind in the possession or under the control of the treasurer on his or her death, resignation, retirement, or removal from office.

ARTICLE V

INDEMNIFICATION

Section 5.1 Right of Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, this Corporation shall indemnify its directors, officers, employees, and other persons described in Section 5238(a) of the California Corporations Code, including persons formerly occupying any such position, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," as that term is used in that Section, and including an action by or in the right of the Corporation, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a person described

in that section. "Expenses," as used in this Bylaw, shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a) of the California Corporations Code.

Section 5.2 Approval of Indemnity. On written request to the Board by any person seeking indemnification under Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c) of the California Corporations Code, the Board shall promptly determine under Section 5238(e) of the California Corporations Code whether the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c) has been met and, if so, the Board shall authorize indemnification. If the Board cannot authorize indemnification because the number of directors who are parties to the proceeding with respect to which indemnification is sought prevents the formation of a quorum of directors who are not parties to that proceeding, the Board shall promptly call a meeting of Members. At that meeting, the Members shall determine under Section 5238(e) of the California Corporations Code whether the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c) has been met and, if so, the Members present at the meeting in person or by proxy shall authorize indemnification.

Section 5.3 Advancement of Expenses. To the fullest extent permitted by law and except as otherwise determines by the Board in a specific instance, expenses incurred by a person seeking indemnification hereunder in defending any proceeding covered hereby shall be advanced by the Corporation before final disposition of the proceeding, on receipt by the Corporation of an undertaking in or on behalf of that person that the advance will be repaid unless it is ultimately determined that the person is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation for those expenses.

ARTICLE VI

INSURANCE

The Corporation shall have the right to purchase and maintain insurance to the full extent permitted by law on behalf of its officers, directors, employees, and other agents, against any liability asserted against or incurred by any officer, director, employee, or agent in such capacity or arising out of the officer's, director's, employee's, or agent's status as such.

ARTICLE VII

RECORDS AND REPORTS

Section 7.1 Maintenance of Corporate Records. The Corporation shall keep:

- (a) Adequate and correct books and records of account; and
- (b) Written minutes of the proceedings of its Board, and Committees of the Board.

Section 7.2 Maintenance and Inspection of Articles and Bylaws. The Corporation shall keep at its Principal Office or if its Principal Office is not in California, at its principal business office in this state, the original or a copy of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws.

Section 7.3 Inspection by Directors. Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect the Corporation's books, records, documents of every kind, physical properties, and the records of each of its subsidiaries. The inspection may be made in person or by the director's agent or attorney. The right of inspection includes the right to copy and make extracts of documents.

Section 7.4 Annual Report. The Board shall cause an annual report to be sent to the directors within one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of the Corporation's fiscal year. That report shall contain the following information, in appropriate detail, for the fiscal year:

(a) The assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the Corporation as at the end of the fiscal year.

(b) The principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds.

(c) The revenue or receipts of the Corporation both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes.

(d) The expenses or disbursements of the Corporation for both general and restricted purposes.

(e) Any other information required by these Bylaws.

Section 7.5 Report of Accountants. The annual report shall be accompanied by any report on it of independent accountants or, if there is not such report, by the certificate of an authorized officer of the Corporation that such statements were prepared without audit from the Corporation's books and records.

Section 7.6 Waiver of Annual Report. This requirement of an annual report shall not apply if the Corporation receives less than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) in gross receipts during the fiscal year, provided, however, that the information specified above for inclusion in an annual report must be furnished annually to all directors and to any Member who requests it in writing.

Section 7.7 Annual Statement of Certain Transactions and Indemnification. As part of the annual report to all Members, or as a separate document if no annual report is issued, the Corporation shall annually prepare and mail or deliver to each Member and furnish to each director a statement of any transaction or indemnification of the following kind within one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of the Corporation's fiscal year:

(a) Any transaction (i) in which the Corporation, its parent, or its subsidiary was a party, (ii) in which an "interested person," as defined below, had a direct or indirect material financial interest, and (iii) which involved more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or was one of a number of transactions with the same interested person involving, in the aggregate, more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). For this purpose, an "interested person," is either of the following:

(1) Any director or officer of the Corporation, its parent, or subsidiary (but mere common directorship shall not be considered such an interest); or

(2) Any holder of more than ten percent (10%) of the voting power of the Corporation, its parent, or its subsidiary.

(b) Any indemnification or advance aggregating more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) paid during the fiscal year to any officer or director of the Corporation under Article VII of these Bylaws, unless the indemnification has already been approved by the Members of the Board in accordance with Section 5238(e)(2) of the California Corporations Code.

The above-referenced statement shall include a brief description of the transaction, the names of the interested persons involved, their relationship to the Corporation, the nature of their interest in the transaction and, if practicable, the amount of that interest, provided that if the transaction was with a partnership in which the interested person is a partner, only the interest of the partnership need be stated.

ARTICLE VIII

CONSTRUCTION AND DEFINITIONS

Unless the context requires otherwise, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions in the California Nonprofit Corporation Law shall govern the construction of these Bylaws. Without limiting the generality of the preceding sentence, the masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter, the singular includes the plural, the plural includes the singular, and the term "person" includes both a legal entity and a natural person.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENTS

Section 9.1 Amendment by Board

9.1.2 High Vote Requirement. If any provision of these Bylaws requires the vote of a larger proportion of the Board than is otherwise required by law, that provision may not be altered, amended, or repealed except by that greater vote.

ARTICLE X

MISCELLANEOUS

Section 10.1 Depositories. All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited to the credit of the Corporation in such banks or financial institutions as shall be designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 10.2 Approved Signatures. Approvals for signatures necessary on contracts, checks, and orders for the payment, receipt, or deposit of money, and access to securities of the Corporation shall be provided by resolution for determination of the Board of Directors.

Section 10.3 Budget. If expenditures for any particular fiscal year will exceed the annual income for that particular year, expenditures in excess of annual income must be approved by the Board of Directors.

Section 10.4 Legal Counsel. Independent legal counsel may be retained by the Corporation to ensure compliance with federal and state requirements; review and advise on any legal instruments such as leases, contracts, property purchases, or sale; and review and advise on any official statements developed for the press and media.
