AND RECOVERY RESOURCES (2) ENHANCING OUR SERVICES TO ENSURE THAT WE MEET THE NEEDS OF ARTISTS AT ALL PHASES OF THEIR CAREERS THROUGH THESE EFFORTS, WE SERVED 639 INDIVIDUAL ARTISTS AND ARTS PROFESSIONALS IN ADDITION TO OUR OWN PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, WE PLAYED A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THE EMERGING NATIONAL MOVEMENT WITHIN THE ARTS SECTOR TO IMPROVE THE OVERALL SAFETY NET (BEFORE, DURING AND FOR ENTREPRENEURS IN THE ARTS TO TRANSFORM THE ECONOMY ACT OF 2016 OR THE CREATE ACT OF 2016 (S 2648), IS A COMPREHENSIVE MEASURE TO SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF ARTS BUSINESSES, JOBS, AND THE GROWTH OF THE CREATIVE ECONOMY IN THE UNITED STATES NATIONAL COALITION FOR ARTS' PREPAREDNESS AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE (NCAPER) SINCE SPEARHEADING THE FORMATION OF THE COALITION IN 2006, CERF+ EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CORNELIA CAREY HAS SERVED AS A CO-CHAIR OF THIS CROSS-DISCIPLINARY VOLUNTARY TASK FORCE THROUGH THE COALITION'S EFFORTS, THE URGENCY OF ADDRESSING THE ISSUE OF THE VULNERABILITY OF THE ARTS AND CULTURE SECTOR HAS GAINED GREATER ATTENTION, AND IN SPRING 2016, THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS HOSTED A NATIONAL CONVENING ON "READINESS AND RESILIENCY ADVANCING A COLLABORATIVE AND NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE ARTS IN TIMES OF EMERGENCIES" CAREY, ALONG WITH 20+ NATIONAL ARTS LEADERS, FUNDERS, AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT EXPERTS REVIEWED IMPROVEMENTS BY THE COALITION AND OTHERS SINCE HURRICANES KATRINA AND RITA, AND IDENTIFIED A FRAMEWORK FOR NEW COLLECTIVE ACTION IN THE AREAS OF RESEARCH/DATA, EDUCATION/TRAINING, LOCAL CAPACITY-BUILDING AND INTEGRATION WITH EXISTING EMERGENCY SYSTEMS, AND ARTS PHILANTHROPY POLICY AND ADVOCACY CERF+, BESIDES PLAYING A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THE COALITION'S DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION THROUGH ITS PIONEERING PHASE, HAS SERVED AS THE PROJECT MANAGER FOR SEVERAL NEW DISASTER PLANNING/RECOVERY RESOURCES MOST NOTABLY, "THE ESSENTIAL GUIDELINES FOR ARTS RESPONDERS ORGANIZING IN THE MIDST OF DISASTER," PRODUCED IN 2011, WHICH HAS BEEN ACTIVELY USED AS A "JUST IN TIME" ARTS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAYBOOK AFTER A NUMBER OF RECENT MAJOR DISASTERS CURRENTLY, CERF+ IS OVERSEEING THE REVISION AND ADAPTATION OF THE ARTS RESPONDER HANDBOOK-A DRAFT MANUAL WE DEVELOPED TO GUIDE ADVANCE DISASTER PLANNING-INTO A STREAMLINED DIGITAL PUBLICATION TITLED "THE CULTURAL PLACEKEEPING GUIDE," IT IS GEARED TO COMMUNITIES OF ALL SIZES AND GEOGRAPHIES FROM A RURAL ARTISTS' COLLECTIVE TO AN URBAN NEIGHBORHOOD, CULTURAL DISTRICT, OR COUNTY AND WILL BE AVAILABLE IN SPRING 2017 HAVING MET THE OBJECTIVE OF AN "EVOLVED COALITION" WITH A FORMAL GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE, CERF+ HAS COMPLETED OUR CO-CHAIR TOUR OF DUTY, BUT WILL CONTINUE AS AN ACTIVE STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBER

OUR WALL GUIDE STUDIO PROTECTORS WERE DISTRIBUTED TO 654 PEOPLE, INCLUDING CERF+ BENEFICIARIES AND APPLICANTS, WORKSHOP PARTICIPANTS AND PRESENTERS, ART STUDENTS AND ARTS PROFESSIONALS. COVER YOUR A'S ART, ASSETS + ARCHIVES IN FY 2016, NINE ART SCHOOLS/ART DEPARTMENTS ENROLLED FACULTY AND CAREER SERVICES STAFF IN OUR "COVER YOUR A'S" CURRICULUM TRAINING WORKSHOPS HELD AT THE MINNEAPOLIS COLLEGE OF ART & DESIGN (OCTOBER 2015) AND AT THE FRIST CENTER FOR VISUAL ARTS, NASHVILLE (SEPTEMBER 2016). WITH MORE THAN 30 INSTITUTIONS NOW USING OUR TEACHING MODULES, THIS MEANS THAT 1,200-1,500 ART STUDENTS AT THE CERTIFICATE, BFA AND MFA LEVELS WILL RECEIVE CAREER PROTECTION INSTRUCTION AS PART OF THEIR PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE CLASSES IN THE CURRENT ACADEMIC YEAR. EDUCATION AND TRAINING WORKSHOPS CERF+ ATTENDED FOURTEEN NATIONAL, REGIONAL, AND STATE CONFERENCES WHERE WE PRESENTED SEVEN WORKSHOPS ON ARTISTS' EMERGENCY AND CAREER PROTECTION SAFEGUARDS AND ARTISTS' LEGACY PLANNING. 594 ARTISTS, ARTS PROFESSIONALS, AND REPRESENTATIVES OF GOVERNMENT AND COMMUNITY AGENCIES AND OTHER RELIEF PROVIDERS PARTICIPATED IN THESE SESSIONS AT MEETINGS OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL ON EDUCATION FOR THE CERAMIC ARTS, NATIONAL VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATIONS ACTIVE IN DISASTER, THE FURNITURE SOCIETY, NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE ART ASSEMBLY FOLK AND TRADITIONAL ARTS COORDINATORS, OKLAHOMA ARTS CONFERENCE, VERMONT CRAFTS COUNCIL AND ST LOUIS VOLUNTEER LAWYERS FOR THE ARTS. IN OUR HOME STATE (VERMONT), CERF+, IN COOPERATION WITH THE VERMONT COUNCIL ON THE ARTS, BROUGHT TOGETHER COMMUNITY ARTISTS, ARTS ADMINISTRATORS AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTORS FROM THE AMERICAN RED CROSS FROM VERMONT AND NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND FOR A FORUM TO EXPLORE POSSIBILITIES FOR TRAINING "ARTIST RESPONDERS" TO BE PART OF IMMEDIATE AND LONG TERM RECOVERY TEAMS. ADVOCACY TOOL REPLACEMENT BILL SINCE 2012, CERF+ HAS LED A NATIONAL EFFORT TO CHANGE THE FEMA REGULATION ABOUT ARTISTS- AND OTHER SELF-EMPLOYED WORKERS' ELIGIBILITY FOR POST-DISASTER TOOL REPLACEMENT. THIS YEAR WE MADE SIGNIFICANT GAINS, ASSISTED BY THE FEDERAL AFFAIRS STAFF FROM AMERICANS FOR THE ARTS. CERF+'S PROPOSAL FOR CHANGING THE LANGUAGE IN THE STAFFORD ACT WAS ADAPTED INTO A "STATEMENT OF CONCERN" THAT WAS INCLUDED IN THE 2016 CONGRESSIONAL ARTS HANDBOOK FOR NATIONAL ARTS ADVOCACY DAY ON MARCH 8 IN WASHINGTON DC. IN ADDITION, OUR PROPOSAL WAS A COMPONENT OF A NEW LEGISLATIVE ARTS PACKAGE THAT WAS INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE ON MARCH 8 BY NEW MEXICO SENATOR TOM UDALL, AND FORMALLY ANNOUNCED DURING THE ARTS ADVOCACY DAY KICK OFF. THE COMPREHENSIVE RESOURCES FOR ENTREPRENEURS IN THE ARTS TO TRANSFORM THE ECONOMY ACT OF 2016 OR THE CREATE ACT OF 2016 (S 2648), IS A COMPREHENSIVE MEASURE TO SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF ARTS BUSINESSES, JOBS, AND THE GROWTH OF THE CREATIVE ECONOMY IN THE UNITED STATES. NATIONAL COALITION FOR ARTS' PREPAREDNESS AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE (NCAPER) SINCE SPEARHEADING THE FORMATION OF THE COALITION IN 2006, CERF+ EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CORNELIA CAREY HAS SERVED AS A CO-CHAIR OF THIS CROSS-DISCIPLINARY VOLUNTARY TASK FORCE. THROUGH THE COALITION'S EFFORTS, THE URGENCY OF ADDRESSING THE ISSUE OF THE VULNERABILITY OF THE ARTS AND CULTURE SECTOR HAS GAINED GREATER ATTENTION, AND IN SPRING 2016, THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS HOSTED A NATIONAL CONVENING ON "READINESS AND RESILIENCY: ADVANCING A COLLABORATIVE AND NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE ARTS IN TIMES OF EMERGENCIES." CAREY, ALONG WITH 20+ NATIONAL ARTS LEADERS, FUNDERS, AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT EXPERTS REVIEWED IMPROVEMENTS BY THE COALITION AND OTHERS SINCE HURRICANES KATRINA AND RITA, AND IDENTIFIED A FRAMEWORK FOR NEW COLLECTIVE ACTION IN THE AREAS OF RESEARCH/DATA, EDUCATION/TRAINING, LOCAL CAPACITY-BUILDING AND INTEGRATION WITH EXISTING EMERGENCY SYSTEMS, AND ARTS PHILANTHROPY POLICY AND ADVOCACY. CERF+, BESIDES PLAYING A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THE COALITION'S DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION THROUGH ITS PIONEERING PHASE, HAS SERVED AS THE PROJECT MANAGER FOR SEVERAL NEW DISASTER PLANNING/RECOVERY RESOURCES. MOST NOTABLY, "THE ESSENTIAL GUIDELINES FOR ARTS RESPONDERS ORGANIZING IN THE MIDST OF DISASTER," PRODUCED IN 2011, WHICH HAS BEEN ACTIVELY USED AS A "JUST IN TIME" ARTS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAYBOOK AFTER A NUMBER OF RECENT MAJOR DISASTERS. CURRENTLY, CERF+ IS OVERSEEING THE REVISION AND ADAPTATION OF THE ARTS RESPONDER HANDBOOK-A DRAFT MANUAL WE DEVELOPED TO GUIDE ADVANCE DISASTER PLANNING-INTO A STREAMLINED DIGITAL PUBLICATION TITLED "THE CULTURAL PLACEKEEPING GUIDE." IT IS GEARED TO COMMUNITIES OF ALL SIZES AND GEOGRAPHIES FROM A RURAL ARTISTS' COLLECTIVE TO AN URBAN NEIGHBORHOOD, CULTURAL DISTRICT, OR COUNTY AND WILL BE AVAILABLE IN SPRING 2017. HAVING MET THE OBJECTIVE OF AN "EVOLVED COALITION" WITH A FORMAL GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE, CERF+ HAS COMPLETED OUR CO-CHAIR TOUR OF DUTY, BUT WILL CONTINUE AS AN ACTIVE STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBER.</p> |
